On March 21, 2012, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to consider establishing requirements for gas pipeline operators to report data and documentation to the Commission of damage to pipeline facilities in violation of Chapter 19.122 RCW. The Commission filed the CR-101 under Docket PG-120345.

The Commission initiated this rulemaking to determine whether it needs to amend its reporting rules if it is to enforce violations of RCW 19.122.055, .075 and .090 in an efficient and timely manner.

To assist in determining whether to establish additional incident reporting requirements, as well as the specifics of such requirements, the Commission requests that interested persons provide written comments on the benefits and costs associated with additional incident reporting requirements generally and address the questions outlined in the attached notice.

Written comments on the CR-101 and the questions listed above to consider damage reporting rules for intrastate gas pipeline operators must be filed with the Commission no later than **5:00 p.m., Monday, April 23, 2012**.

In addition to filing written comments, interested persons are invited to attend a stakeholder workshop on Thursday, May 10, 2012, beginning at 1:30 p.m., in Room 206, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington. At the workshop, Commission staff will review and discuss comments with the stakeholders.
