Dear Sir or Madam:

As you are aware, on August 6, 2013, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission issued a Penalty Assessment against Always Able Moving Service in the amount of \$1,800 for violation of WAC 480-15-480, which requires household goods carriers to file an annual report with the Commission by May 1 each year. Always Able Moving Service failed to file its 2012 annual report, and has incurred a penalty of \$1,800. The Commission sent Always Able Moving Service a Second Notice on September 11, 2013, and a Final Notice on October 16, 2013.

The Commission has not received the \$1,800 payment due and owing.

This is to notify you that the Commission intends to forward your outstanding debt to a collection agency for collection. You likely will incur additional expenses and fees, including costs of collection, attorney's fees, and interest. These expenses and fees will be added to your outstanding \$1,800 balance.
