RE: Data Request

To: Avista Corp.

Cascade Natural Gas Northwest Natural Gas PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Puget Sound Energy

Under Washington state law, RCW 80.04.090, the commission has the right to inspect the accounts, books, papers and documents of any investor-owned electric or natural gas company doing business in this state.

In order to properly evaluate the issues before the commission in Docket U-131087, commission staff requires the following documents and information:

- 1. For the years 2009 through 2013, the number of Washington residential customers and meters, by year.
- 2. For the years 2009 through 2013, the number of field interactions of any type (including but not limited to: meter testing, meter reading, disconnecting service, reconnecting service, etc.) with customers in Washington state, by year.
- 3. For the years 2009 through 2013, the number of disconnections in Washington state, by year.
- 4. For the years 2009 through 2013, the number of payments and the amount of those payments received to stop disconnection at a service address in Washington state, by year.
- 5. Of those payments received to stop disconnection at the service address listed in number 4, above, a breakdown by the type and amount of each payment (cash, credit card, check, money order), by year.
- 6. For the years 2009 through 2013, the number of documented threats against company personnel in Washington state, by year, including the following information: type or context of each threat, method of threat delivery (e.g., in the field while trying to

complete a disconnection, in the field while trying to complete a reconnection, in the field for anything other than a disconnection or reconnection, over the phone, at a company office, etc.), and the actual number of documented robberies or assaults on company employees in Washington state while working in the field.

- 7. For the years 2009 through 2013, the total number employee on the job injuries, by year and type of injury.
- 8. For the years 2009 through 2013, the total number and locations of free pay stations.
- 9. For the years 2009 through 2013, the total number and locations of pay stations that accept payment for a fee.
- 10. The name, title, telephone number, and email address of a company contact person that our staff can work with directly for questions that may arise concerning any details of the data.
