

"Applicant", is a corporation duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the State of Oregon. It has duly qualified and is authorized to transact business in the State of Washington and is in good standing as a foreign corporation under the laws of said state.

Applicant's corporate name was changed from Portland Cas & Coke Company to worthwest matural Cas Company, effective July 1, 1955.

For further information regarding Applicant, the general character of its business and the territory it serves, reference is hereby made to Applicant's Annual Reports to the Commission, filed pursuant to the Rules and Regulations of the Commission and to other documents and data pertinent to Applicant on file in the office of the Commission, including the applications filed in the causes referred to in the next succeeding paragraph.

In addition to the areas it serves in the State of Oregon, Applicant is engaged in selling and distributing natural gas to the general public in the cities of Vancouver, Camas and Washougal and areas adjacent thereto in Clark County, Washington, pursuant to Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 1, issued by the Commission December 16, 1955, in Cause No. U-8826, as amended July 17, 1956 in Cause No. U-8883 (see Exhibit B).

By its order of December 26, 1961 in Cause Nos. U-9206 and U-9207, the Commission approved the application of Columbia Cas Company for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate a Cas Plant for Mire in Bingen and White Salmon and areas adjacent thereto. The application of Mt. Adams Cas Co. Inc., was denied in said order. The Commission was subsequently advised by letter dated March 28, 1962 that Columbia Cas Company had decided not to proceed with the construction of a distribution

April 9, 1962, the Commission amended Columbia Cas Company's Certificate of Public Convenience and Recessity No. 10, so as to exclude certification for Bingen and White Salmon and areas adjacent thereto.

Thereafter, at the request of residents of the aforesaid areas, Applicant made a study which indicated it was economically feasible to build a distribution system designed to make natural gas service available in the Bingen and White Salmon areas.

The proposed service area, as outlined on the map attached to the within application as Exhibit A, embraces an area extending approximately 18 miles west of White Salmon, one and one-half miles east of Bingen, and five miles north of the state line between Oregon and Washington. This area is largely rural but is gradually being built up by residences and small commercial operations along the state and county highways. There are a number of potential industrial development sites within the proposed area along the Columbia River. The incorporated cities of Bingen and White Calmon are located in close proximity to one another at the eastern and of the proposed service area, and have populations of approximately 630 and 1590, respectively. The unincorporated community of Carson is located in the seastern portion of the proposed area and Applicant has made a preliminary study indicating that it may be feasible to provide service in that community. Applicant believes that the area for which it has requested certification covers the territory in which normal growth will be experienced.

To other gas company is providing natural gas utility service for residential, commercial or industrial uses within the boundaries of the area described. To the best of Applicant's impowledge and belief, bt. Adams

Gas Co., Inc., is no longer interested in serving the area and Applicant snows of no other Company planning or in a position to do so.

Applicant has entered into a five year contract with Bingen Veneer & Plywood Company, the major industrial enterprise in the area, for a firm supply of natural gas and estimates that during the first three years it will obtain approximately 200 residential, 23 commercial and two industrial customers. Applicant believes that the revenue to be derived from the estimated residential, commercial and industrial customers outlined above will be fully sufficient to justify the investment required to provide service as proposed herein.

Applicant proposes to make its pervice available in the proposed area at the same rates which are applicable in its presently certificated areas in the State of Washington and upon the granting of the certificate requested herein, Applicant will file First Revision of Original Sheet 1 to its Tariff WN U-5, (see Exhibit J).

Applicant has an agreement with El Paso Natural Gas Company, its pipeline supplier, whereby the existing contract between the parties for firm gas, effective through January 31, 1981, will be smended to include the additional volumes necessary to assure Applicant a sufficient supply of natural gas to meet the present and anticipated requirements of the proposed service area, to be delivered at a Cate Station or Cate Stations to be located in said area. As indicated in Exhibit A, El Paso Natural Gas Company's pipeline traverses the area sought to be certified.

Natural gas for the Bingen and White Selmon areas will be received by Applicant from the pipeline at a Gate Station to be located between these cities and Applicant will construct an initial distribution

system in the area, consisting of approximately nine and one-half miles of two-inch and one-inch mains, two district regulators, and the service lines and meter equipment necessary for individual users, in accordance with the provisions of the Commission's order in Cause Nos. U-8799 and U-8800 (see Exhibit C). Applicant is willing and able to expand this distribution system to serve all customers within the proposed area who desire natural gas service, in accordance with its regularly established main extension policy, as set forth in Rule 12 of its Rules and Regulations, on file with the Commission.

Applicant proposes to maintain its facilities in, along, under and upon state highways, county reads and city streets within the area described in Exhibit A, pursuant to franchises or permits granted by the appropriate state, county and municipal authorities. Applicant has heretofore obtained franchises from the two incorporated cities of Bingen and White Ealmon, certified copies of which are attached to the within application as Exhibits G and H, respectively, and representatives of Elickitat and Sharania Counties have indicated a willingness to grant Applicant franchises occutensive with the certificate the Commission deems it appropriate to approve herein. Applications will be made to the Washington State Highway Commission under the provisions of Chapter 13, Laws of 1937, as amended, for such franchises as may be required for the use of state highways.

Applicant estimates that it will be required to invest approximately \$187,000 for new distribution facilities in the proposed area within the next three years, most of which will be expended in the first year for the backbone system shown in Exhibit C. This investment will be made, however, as and when facilities are required and will be financed, along with other expenditures

of the came nature to be made elsewhere in Applicant's system, in accordance with overall plans heretofore referred to and described in connection with it's application filed with the Commission on May 14, 1962, in Cause No. U-9373, and reference is made thereto for further details.

Exhibit I has been attached to the within application for the purpose of affording the Commission a broader view of Applicant's existing and proposed service areas.





Legal Description of Service Area of Portland Gas & Coke Company

Beginning at the intersection of the north line of Sec. 13, T3N, R1W, Willamette Meridian, or that line extended west, with the Oregon-Washington state boundary in the Columbia River; thence east along the north line of Sec. 13, T3N, R1W, along the north lines of Sec. 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, and 13, T3N, R1E, and along the north lines of Sec. 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, and 13, to the northeast corner of Sec. 13, T3N, R2E; thence south along the township line to the southeast corner of Sec. 24, T2N, R2E; thence east along the north lines of Sec. 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, and 25, T2N, R3E, and along the north lines of Sec. 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, and 25, to the northeast corner of Sec. 25, T2N, R4E; thence south along the township line to the Oregon-Washington state boundary in the Columbia River; thence westerly, and northerly following the Oregon-Washington state boundary to the point of beginning; all being within Clark County, Washington.
