NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO FILE WRITTEN COMMENTS (By August 15, 2022) and NOTICE OF WORKSHOP (Set for October 11, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.)

Re: Rulemaking to update motor carrier safety rules in Chapters WAC 480-15; household goods companies; WAC 480-30 passenger transportation companies, and WAC 480-70 solid waste companies. Docket T-220252

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On July 15, 2022, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to consider revisions to chapters 480-15, 480-30, and 480-70 of the Washington Administrative Code (WAC). Specifically, these are safety rules that govern household goods, passenger transportation, and solid waste collection companies.

The Commission filed the CR-101 under Docket T-220252.

The review of these safety rules is intended to improve consistency between the Commission's rules, Washington State Patrol's (WSP) rules, and Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR). The rulemaking is consistent with and supports initiatives in the Commission's 2021-23 Strategic Business Plan by advancing public safety. The purpose of the rulemaking is to repeal, amend, and adopt motor carrier safety rules and improve safety rules to allow for more equitable treatment to those required to comply with the rules.

Responses to the following questions and requests for comment based on the attached report would be useful to the Commission in conducting its inquiry:

1. Are any of the safety rules obsolete, duplicative, or ambiguous to a degree that warrants repeal or revision? If yes, please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation.

- 2. Have laws or other circumstances changed so that any safety rules should be repealed or amended? If yes, please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation.
- 3. Are the safety rules written and organized in a clear and concise manner so that those to whom the safety rules apply can easily understand them? If no, please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation.
- 4. Are the rules consistent with the legislative intent of the authorizing statutes ? If no, please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation.
- 5. Are the safety rules equitably applied to those required to comply with them? If not, please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation.
- 6. Should safety rules be modified to eliminate or adjust disproportionate impacts on the regulated industry? If yes, please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation?
- 7. Should any safety rules be strengthened to provide additional protections? If yes, please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation.
- 8. Which safety rules, if any, conflict with WSP rules or FMCSRs? Please identify the rule(s) and provide a brief explanation.
- 9. Can the Commission structure its safety rules in this rulemaking to make it easier for motor carriers to comply with safety regulations while still maintaining consistency with WSP rules and the FMCSRs?
- 10. Please provide any comments or feedback to the attached Motor Carrier Safety Increase Regulatory Consistency Report and Commission staff recommendations.

The Commission invites initial written comments in response to these questions and will conduct a workshop to address the relevant issues and comments.
