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- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket UT-093012 involves a petition by TracFone Wireless, Inc. (TracFone or Company), seeking designation as a eligible telecommunications carrier, or ETC, pursuant to Section 214(e)(2) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the Act), and Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-123-030.
- TracFone's petition was first brought before the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) at its open meeting on November 25, 2009. An amended petition was brought before the Commission at its February 25, 2010, open meeting, and continued to the Commission's March 11, 2010, meeting. At that meeting the Commission set the petition for hearing.
- 3 **CONFERENCE.** The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington on April 12, 2010, before Administrative Law Judge Ann E. Rendahl.
- 4 **APPEARANCES.** Mitchell F. Brecher and Debra McGuire Mercer, Greenberg Traurig, LLP, Washington, D.C., represent TracFone. Gregory J. Trautman and Michael A. Fassio, Assistant Attorneys General, Olympia, Washington, represent the

Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff).¹ Richard A Finnigan, attorney, Olympia, Washington, represents the Washington Independent Telephone Association (WITA). Contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this Order.

- 5 **PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION.** WITA petitioned in writing and appeared at the conference to intervene in the docket. No party objected to the petition for intervention, which was granted.
- **DISCOVERY.** It does not appear that discovery will be required in this proceeding. If parties see a need for discovery, any party may move that the Commission invoke the Commission's discovery rules, WAC 480-07-400 425.
- SETTLEMENT DISCUSSIONS. Prior to the prehearing conference, counsel for Commission Staff notified the presiding officer that Staff and the Company had reached an agreement on the issues in dispute, and planned to file a settlement agreement. The settlement was the focus of scheduling discussions at the conference.
- PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. The parties agreed on a procedural schedule during the conference. The Commission adopts this procedural schedule, which is also attached to this Order as Appendix B.

- DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS. Parties must file an original plus ten (10) copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. These materials must conform to the format and publication guidelines in WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. The Commission prefers that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Executive Director and Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided through the Commission's Web Portal (www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail delivery to <<u>records@utc.wa.gov</u>>. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette or CD including the filed document(s). Parties must furnish electronic copies in MS Word 6.0 (or later) supplemented by a separate file in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format. Parties must follow WAC 480-07-140(5) in organizing and identifying electronic files.
- 13 ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
