- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket UG-060256 involves the filing of tariffs seeking a general increase in the rates and charges of Cascade Natural Gas Corporation. The Commission suspended the proposed tariffs and directed that the proposal be set for hearing.
- CONFERENCE. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington on April 11, 2006, before Administrative Law Judge C. Robert Wallis upon notice to all interested parties.
- 3 APPEARANCES. James Van Nostrand, Stoel Rives LLP, Portland, Oregon, represents Cascade Natural Gas Corporation ("Cascade" or "Company"). Judith Krebs, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represents the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of the Attorney General. Greg Trautman,

Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff ("Commission Staff").¹

- Vincent J. Diaz, Fox Island, Washington, represents the International Chemical Workers Union Council/UFCW Local 121-C. Ed Finklea and Chad Stokes, attorneys, Cable Huston Benedict Haagensen & Lloyd LLP, Portland, Oregon, represent the Northwest Industrial Gas Users ("NWIGU"). Nancy Glaser and Danielle Dixon, staff members, Seattle, WA, represent the NW Energy Coalition. Brad Purdy, attorney, Boise, Idaho, represents the Energy Project. Scott Magie, project director, Longview, Washington, represents the Mint Farm Energy Center LLC. The majority of the contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this order.² Appendix A will be updated on receipt of the transcript, and sent to parties via e-mail.
- 5 **PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION.** Five entities petitioned in writing to become intervenors. They included the International Chemical Workers Union, Northwest Industrial Gas Users, NW Energy Coalition, Energy Project, and the Mint Farm. In addition, Doug Betzold of Cost Management Services, Inc. petitioned orally at the conference.
- 6 No parties objected to any proposed intervention. Each of the petitioning entities identified a substantial interest in the proceeding, and the petitions are granted.
- 7 **MOTION TO COMPEL.** Public Counsel filed a motion to compel Cascade to supplement its rate case filing. The Company and several other parties, including petitioners for intervention, with the approval of the bench, responded. The parties updated and repeated their arguments during the conference.

There is an *"ex parte* wall" separating the Commissioners, the presiding Administrative Law Judge, and the Commissioners' policy and accounting advisors from all parties, including advocacy Staff. *RCW 34.05.455*.

Only the lead counsel will receive service of Commission-generated communications; counsel and the party's designated client representative will receive formal service of Commission orders.

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- Ms. Krebs, for Public Counsel, argued that Cascade failed to follow the practice that other companies follow in distributing work papers with prefiled testimony and exhibits. She concluded that the Commission should order Cascade to provide certain supplementary information. Other parties supported the motion, noting that having information at an early stage reduces procedural effort and time. Cascade pointed out that its filing complied with the letter of the existing rule, acknowledged confusion resulting from inadvertent mislabeling, produced copies of work papers for distribution at the conference, and pledged to provide requested material promptly on request. As indicated at the conference, we deny the motion to compel in light of Cascade's compliance with the rule and willingness to provide the requested documents speedily.³
- 9 Parties also asked for a "working" model of Cascade's cost of service ("COS") study, which they represented is critical to the proposed tariff filing. They sought a version in which they could enter proposed changes and determine the result. Cascade responded that its model is proprietary, not Cascade-owned. Cascade indicated that it has no right to allow the use proposed release of the proprietary model. The Company offered to pay the cost of having the consultant make model runs for other parties, and pledged to facilitate such runs.
- 10 The Company must provide documentation for the restrictions on use of the study. Subject to doing so, and to providing speedy runs to parties at Cascade's expense, it need not provide working models. Cascade must also provide reasonable access to persons knowledgeable with the model if questions arise about its operation or the results of specific model runs, and arrange for confidential runs if necessary during the deliberative phase of this proceeding.
- 11 **PROTECTIVE ORDER.** We will enter a standard form protective order in this docket at the request of the parties. If it appears to parties that additional protections appear to be needed, they may seek modification.
- 12 **DISCOVERY.** The parties asked that the discovery rules be invoked, under WAC 480-07-400. The matter is one that qualifies for discovery, and the discovery rules,

³ We urge all counsel with procedural concerns to speak with opposing counsel to determine whether they may be accommodated without the need for motions and responses.

WAC 480-07-400 through 425, are invoked. The parties agreed to reduce the time for responses to discovery requests to seven days after August 15, 2006 and to five days after September 12, 2006. All parties pledged to make best efforts to comply with the deadlines. It is especially important in times of tight deadlines that counsel be proactive about discussing potential delays with persons needing the data. Doing so will avoid the need for litigation and may identify less time-consuming alternatives.

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Evergreen Park Drive SW, Olympia, Washington. for the purpose of distributing exhibits to be used on cross examination, for marking exhibits, and for addressing any procedural questions the parties or the commission may raise. Objections to prefiled exhibits must be made no later than the time of this conference.

NOTICE OF HEARING: Hearing in this matter is set for October 9, 2006, beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the hearing room, Room 206, in the Commission's headquarters office, 1300 South Evergreen Park Drive SW, Olympia, Washington. The Commission has reserved October 9 through 13, if needed, for the hearing at that location.

14 SERVICE AND COMMUNICATION AMONG PARTIES AND WITH

BENCH. Parties must include the administrative law judge and advisory staff when providing electronic copies of filed materials to the Commission and other parties. Failure to do so may cause delays and could render the filing insufficient. **Please note:** merely filing via the Commission's web portal is <u>not</u> sufficient to satisfy this requirement. E-mail contact information for the advisory staff is included in Attachment C.

- 15 FORMAT OF ELECTRONIC DOCUMENTS. Parties must include an electronic file of each document in Word or Excel, as appropriate, unless such a file is not available and cannot be reasonably created (an extensive passage from a printed document not created by the parties, for example). Excel files must include and enable all entries and formulas necessary to produce the result shown on the printed version. Parties should take care to delete metadata not needed for hearing purposes, such as identities of authors and editing trails.
- 16 **DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS.** Parties must file an original plus **eleven** copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. These materials must conform with the format and publication guidelines set forth in WAC 480-07-395 and 480-07-460, and must be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.

- 17 Parties must also file one copy of a complete redacted version of any document containing confidential information, plus the needed appropriate electronic versions of the redacted text. Each redacted document must be plainly labeled on its cover sheet, first page, and media.
- All filings must be mailed to the Commission Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250, or delivered (by hand or courier) to the Commission's Records Center at the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W., Olympia, Washington, 98504. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- 19 Parties must provide an electronic copy of all filings by web portal or e-mail delivery to <<u>records@wutc.wa.gov</u>>. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s). Parties must furnish an electronic file in MS Word or MS Excel, supplemented by a separate file in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format. Parties must organize and identify electronic files as specified in WAC 480-07-140(5).
- 20 ELECTRONIC FILING. Parties may only file documents electronically with the Commission in this proceeding with the permission of the administrative law judge. Under WAC 480-07-145(6), electronic filing of documents provides a one-day extension of the paper-filing requirement. If, at any time during this proceeding, parties are authorized to file documents with the Commission electronically under WAC 480-07-145(6), Parties must submit the document to records@wutc.wa.gov, and file an original, plus eleven copies, of the document with the Commission by the following business day. Parties must also file the required redacted version of any confidential document.
- 21 ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. Parties are encouraged to consider means of resolving disputes informally. The Commission does have limited ability to provide dispute resolution services; if you wish to explore those services, please call the Director, Administrative Law Division, at 360-664-1142.

NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
