- JUDGE CAILLE: We are here today for the
- 3 first prehearing conference in the proceeding in Docket
- 4 No. TS-050294, which concerns the Application of
- 5 Mosquito Fleet for authority to transfer all rights
- 6 under Certificate No. BC-125 in the name of Pacific
- 7 Boat Enterprises doing business as Mosquito Fleet to
- 8 Mosquito Fleet, doing business as Mosquito Fleet.
- 9 My name is Karen Caille, and I'm the
- 10 presiding administrative law judge in this proceeding.
- 11 Today is June 8th, 2005, and we are convened in a
- 12 hearing room in Olympia, Washington.
- I would like to start out this morning by
- 14 taking appearances from all the parties. I would ask
- 15 you to state your name, spelling your last name, who
- 16 you represent, your street address and mailing address,
- 17 telephone number, fax number, and e-mail address.
- 18 Could we begin with you, Mr. Wiley?

- 7 JUDGE CAILLE: Thank you. Ms. Krebs?
- 8 MS. KREBS: Thank you. Judith Krebs,
- 9 K-r-e-b-s. I'm with the law firm of Schwerin,
- 10 Campbell, Barnard, LLC. That's S-c-h-w-e-r-i-n,
- 11 Campbell, Barnard, B-a-r-n-a-r-d, and we are at 18 West

- JUDGE CAILLE: Mr. Ross?
- MR. ROSS: Steven N. Ross, R-o-s-s, and I'm
- 20 with the law firm of Wolfstone, Panchot and Bloch.
- 21 Panchot is spelled P-a-n-c-h-o-t. Bloch is B-l-o-c-h.

- 7 MR. SWANSON: Thank you, Your Honor. Chris

- 14 JUDGE CAILLE: Let the record reflect there
- 15 are no other appearances. The Commission has received
- 16 timely protests from Inland Boatmen's Union of the
- 17 Pacific, Puget Sound region, and from the International
- 18 Organization of Masters, Mates, and Pilots, Pacific
- 19 Maritime Region, United Inland Group.
- I have looked over the Protest, and I just
- 21 have a question, and I will admit that I looked this
- 22 over very quickly, but the Protest has two dockets on
- 23 it. It has this docket and another docket as well. In
- 24 reading the Protest, it seemed like it was really
- 25 focused on the Southworth, Seattle route, and the

- 1 proceeding that is before us at this moment is not that
- 2 particular route.
- 3 I know there was some question about the
- 4 legislation that went through during the last
- 5 legislative session, and I was just wondering, I want
- 6 to make sure that both Inland Boatmen's Union and
- 7 International Organization of Masters, Mates, and
- 8 Pilots intend to protest this particular application.
- 9 MS. KREBS: Thank you very much for asking
- 10 that question. We fully intend to withdraw our protest
- 11 in Docket No. TS-050294. The question that we had I
- 12 think has been resolved; that the docket that was held
- 13 in abeyance regarding the Southworth run and its
- 14 relation to Certificate 125 is going to proceed under
- 15 Docket No. TS-042184, and we intend to remain a
- 16 protestant in that docket -- that's TS-042184 -- but we
- 17 will withdraw our protest from TS-050294, and we will
- 18 follow up our comments on the record with a written
- 19 notice of withdrawal.
- 20 JUDGE CAILLE: Thank you very much,
- 21 Ms. Krebs.
- 22 MR. ROSS: Your Honor, this is Steve Ross
- 23 representing Masters, Mates and Pilots, and our
- 24 position mirrors that which was just expressed by
- 25 Ms. Krebs, so we will also be withdrawing our protest

- 1 on this particular docket number.
- 2 JUDGE CAILLE: Correct, and you will continue
- 3 to protest in TS-042184?
- 4 MR. ROSS: That is correct.
- 5 JUDGE CAILLE: Thank you very much. You both
- 6 are excused unless you want to listen in on this. Just
- 7 please do as Ms. Krebs said. Follow up with a letter
- 8 to the Commission on your withdrawal.
- 9 MR. ROSS: All right. Thank you, Your Honor.
- MS. KREBS: Yes. Thank you, Your Honor.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Are we going to need discovery
- 12 in this proceeding? I mean formal discovery.
- 13 MR. SWANSON: This is Chris Swanson for
- 14 Commission staff. Staff has reviewed the Application
- 15 and doesn't have any concerns with fitness at this
- 16 point. It doesn't necessarily oppose the Application
- 17 and doesn't see the need for discovery or for a formal
- 18 hearing. It's not required.
- 19 JUDGE CAILLE: So we could do this on a paper
- 20 record?
- MR. SWANSON: Yes, I believe so.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Why don't we go off the record
- 23 and talk about how we are going to schedule the paper
- 24 filing.
- 25 MR. SWANSON: I'll defer to Bonnie Allen at

- 1 this point. She has a better idea of the procedure
- 2 than I do.
- 3 (Discussion off the record.)
- 4 JUDGE CAILLE: We've had an off-record
- 5 discussion about how to handle this matter on a paper
- 6 record, and pursuant to the discussions I've had with
- 7 the parties, my understanding is that the file is
- 8 complete as is in order for me to grant the transfer.
- 9 Now, for reissuance of the Certificate, there
- 10 are certain other things that we must make sure are
- 11 complete, and I am going to ask Ms. Allen of Commission
- 12 staff to just fill us in on what needs to be submitted
- in order for this to be complete.
- 14 MS. ALLEN: Thank you. As I understand it, I
- 15 believe there are three things that we would need to
- 16 follow up on. We would need the Applicant to complete
- 17 its final tariff or a tariff adoption of the existing
- 18 Company's tariff.
- 19 We would need to have the Applicant submit
- 20 proof of insurance in the new company name, and the
- 21 other one I don't think I mentioned before, but I think
- 22 we need a closing annual report from the outgoing
- 23 company, and those, I believe, are the three things we
- 24 need to issue the certificate.
- 25 JUDGE CAILLE: I believe you also mentioned

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1 the vessel is not the same vessel. MS. ALLEN: I noticed there is a valid 2. inspection in the Application, so we are okay on that. 4 JUDGE CAILLE: All right then. I will, I guess, get an example order from Commission staff, and 5 I will review that and edit it and issue an order which 6 will grant the transfer, subject to the Applicant 7 providing these additional things that Ms. Allen just 8 9 listed, and then there will be a reissuance of the certificate, so with that, is there anything further 10 11 from anyone? 12 MR.
