REQUEST:

Referring to docket UG-152394, Avista Natural Gas Line Extension Allowance Program Semi-Annual Report No. 2: Please provide the “Historical Residential Schedule 101 Hook-ups per Year” represented in Table No. 1, on page 2, including only customers who would have been eligible for the LEAP program excess allowance rebates had the program existed at the time. Specifically, exclude new construction hook-ups. Identify separately the number of homes that were previously master-metered on Fairchild Air Force Base and added to Schedule 101 in 2014.

RESPONSE:

The Company has not conducted an analysis to determine the number of customers that would have been eligible for the LEAP program prior to when the program began on March 1, 2016.

Regarding the Fairchild housing privatization in 2014, approximately 425 meters were added to Schedule 101.
