AT&T Communications of the Pacific Northwest, Inc., (“AT&T”) and Qwest Corporation (“Qwest”) file this updated status report as required by the Notice of Modification of Procedural Schedule. AT&T and Qwest hereby report as follows:

The parties have been involved in a *bona fide* request process. The parties have identified the following issues and report the status thereof:

1. Access Protocol-i.e. methods and timing on how AT&T and other CLECs will access the MTEs. The parties met on June 11, 2001 and plan to meet again in the very near future to discuss resolution of these issues. These will also be issues that are briefed, in part, and the parties anticipate will be discussed in the UT-003022 and UT-003040 workshop beginning July 9, 2001.

1           2.       Need for an LSR- Qwest is asserting the need for an LSR as part of the CLEC  
2 access protocol. AT&T opposes providing an LSR for various reasons. This will also be an issue  
3 that is briefed, in part, and the parties anticipate will be discussed in the UT-003022 and UT-  
4 003040 workshop beginning July 9, 2001.

5           3.       Cost- There are three cost-related issues that the parties have identified. (a) Qwest  
6 is proposing a recurring per-line, per-month charge for access to Qwest-owned MTE network wire.  
7 The parties differ on how much that charge should be. (b) In its SGAT, Qwest references an MTE  
8 initial, nonrecurring inventory charge. Qwest is in the process of developing a cost for that  
9 activity. AT&T is opposed to the concept of paying this type of charge, but is waiting for Qwest's  
10 cost quote to further negotiate this issue. (c) The parties need to address an issue around the  
11 provisioning of and the costs associated with a new building terminal, if such a terminal is  
12 installed. The parties anticipate that these issues will be discussed in the UT-003022 and UT-  
13 003040 workshop beginning July 9, 2001. They also plan to negotiate the issue in the continuing  
14 *bona fide* request process.

15           The parties hope to report further progress on resolving these issues on July 16, 2001.
