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Page 4 1 LACEY, WASHINGTON; FEBRUARY 9, 2021 2. 9:30 A.M. 3 --000--PROCEEDINGS 4 5 6 JUDGE DOYLE: Let's be on the record. Good morning. My name is Samantha Doyle, and I'm the 8 administrative law judge presiding over today's prehearing conference. This is Docket UT-181051, which is captioned 10 11 Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission versus CenturyLink Communications, LLC. 12 This is a complaint for alleged violations 13 under RCW 80.36.080, RCW 80.36.220, Washington 14 Administrative Code 480-120-412, and WAC 480-120-450, 15 16 Subsection 1. Today is Tuesday, February 9th, 2021, and 17 18 the time is approximately 9:30. 19 On December 22nd, 2020, the Commission issued the complaint. When the Company did not file an 20 answer to the complaint within 20 days as required by 21 WAC 480-07-370, Subsection (2)(b), the Commission issued 22 a notice setting the date for this prehearing 23 24 conference. 25 This prehearing conference is a chance for

- 1 parties to discuss a procedural schedule. After today's
- 2 conference, I will enter an order setting out the
- 3 procedural schedule and setting the date for the
- 4 evidentiary hearing.
- 5 On January 29th, 2021, Washington State
- 6 Military Department E911 Coordination filed a petition
- 7 to intervene, which I will address after appearances.
- 8 So let's first take appearances beginning
- 9 with Commission Staff.
- 10 MR. FUKANO: Good morning, Your Honor. This
- 11 is Harry Fukano, Assistant Attorney General, and with me
- 12 is co-counsel Sally Brown, Assistant Attorney General,
- 13 appearing on behalf of Commission Staff.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Thank you.
- 15 And for the Company?
- 16 MR. SHERR: Yes, good morning, Your Honor.
- 17 Adam Sherr, assistant general counsel, appearing for
- 18 CenturyLink.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Thank you.
- 20 And Public Counsel, please.
- MS. SUETAKE: Good morning. This is Nina
- 22 Suetake, appearing on behalf of Public Counsel Unit. My
- 23 co-counsel is Lisa Gafken, but I believe she had
- 24 conflicts at this time.
- 25 JUDGE DOYLE: And for the Washington

- 1 Military Department?
- 2 MS. CORTEZ: Assistant Attorney General Dawn
- 3 Cortez representing the Military Department and the
- 4 State E911 Office.
- 5 JUDGE DOYLE: Great, thank you.
- 6 So let's address the petition to intervene.
- 7 Other than the Washington Military Department, do we
- 8 have anyone else on the call who wishes to petition to
- 9 intervene?
- 10 Okay. Hearing nothing, do we have any
- 11 objection to the Washington Military Department's
- 12 petition to intervene?
- MR. FUKANO: No objection from Staff.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Thank you.
- 15 MR. SHERR: None from CenturyLink, Your
- 16 Honor.
- 17 MS. SUETAKE: And none from Public Counsel.
- 18 JUDGE DOYLE: Okay, great. Hearing no
- 19 objections, that petition is granted.
- MS. CORTEZ: Thank you.
- 21 JUDGE DOYLE: That brings to discovery.
- 22 Would the parties like to have the discovery rules
- 23 available?
- 24 MR. SHERR: Your Honor, this is Adam Sherr
- on behalf of CenturyLink. Yes, we would.

- 1 JUDGE DOYLE: And do any of the other
- 2 parties have any objections?
- 3 MR. FUKANO: No objection from Staff, Your
- 4 Honor.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Okay, great.
- 6 Then during the proceedings at the
- 7 Commission, parties often issue a first data request
- 8 asking that any subsequent data requests and responses
- 9 are shared with every other party. It would make it
- 10 easier on the parties if I include this requirement in
- 11 the prehearing conference order. Are there any
- 12 objections to my including that requirement?
- MR. FUKANO: No objection from Staff, Your
- 14 Honor.
- 15 MS. SUETAKE: No objection from Public
- 16 Counsel.
- 17 MS. CORTEZ: No objection from the Military.
- 18 MR. SHERR: No objection, Your Honor.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Okay. Discovery rules will
- 20 otherwise be conducted according to the Commission's
- 21 procedural rule.
- 22 Moving on to the procedural schedule. The
- 23 parties have submitted an agreed upon schedule; however,
- 24 it did not include a settlement conference date. Have
- 25 the parties had a chance to discuss a date that they

- 1 would like to add to the proposed schedule?
- 2 MR. FUKANO: Good morning, Your Honor.
- 3 Commission Staff has proposed a settlement conference
- 4 date of June 30th, and I have gotten some response back
- 5 to that proposal, but not from all parties.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Do the parties need a moment
- 7 to discuss this? We can take a brief recess.
- 8 MR. SHERR: Your Honor, this is Adam Sherr
- 9 on behalf of CenturyLink. June 30th is fine for
- 10 CenturyLink. I'm not certain -- the -- the suggestion
- 11 came after very recently within the last half an hour,
- 12 so it may be that parties just didn't have an
- 13 opportunity to consider it. So from CenturyLink's
- 14 perspective, that date will work.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Would --
- [Multiple speakers.]
- 17 MS. SUETAKE: -- Public Counsel Unit.
- 18 JUDGE DOYLE: Oh, go right ahead.
- 19 MS. CORTEZ: This is Dawn. I -- I -- that
- 20 date works for me. I have not had a chance to ask my
- 21 client if he can be present that day. I believe he's on
- the phone.
- Adam, are you able to attend on June 30th?
- MR. WASSERMAN: Yes, this is Adam Wasserman.
- 25 I am the E911 coordinator. I am available for June

Page 9 30th. 1 2. MS. CORTEZ: Thank you. 3 JUDGE DOYLE: Thank you. And Public Counsel? 4 MS. SUETAKE: Public Counsel is fine with 5 6 that date. Okay. Well, given it looks JUDGE DOYLE: 8 like we have agreement on the addition of the settlement conference date, would Staff please read the agreed upon schedule into the record? 10 11 MR. FUKANO: Certainly. And there is one 12 other alteration to the proposed procedural schedule. After some discussion, it was -- Washington Military 13 Department request that it be filing its initial 14 testimony on October 7th with the Company or the same 15 16 date as the Company rather than June 29th. But I will 17 read those dates in now. 18 The initial direct testimony from Staff and 19 Public Counsel would be due on July 29th; responsive testimony from CenturyLink and WMD would be on October 20 21 7th; and on October 7th data request response times will 22 shorten from ten business days to seven business days. 23 Cross-answer testimony from all parties would be due on

shortening from seven business days to five business

November 18th with data request response times

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- 1 days; the discovery deadline to issue new data requests
- 2 would be December 9th. The deadline to file hearing --
- 3 exhibits for hearing would be January 3rd. The hearing
- 4 will take place January 10th and 11th; simultaneous
- 5 post-hearing briefing would be February 8th and
- 6 simultaneous reply briefing would be March 1st.
- 7 And I realize I omitted the new settlement
- 8 date, which would occur June 30th.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Thank you.
- 10 I will confirm with the parties --
- 11 MR. SHERR: Your Honor? I apologize. This
- 12 is Adam Sherr. Just to confirm, make sure all parties
- 13 are on the same page, I want to confirm that the
- 14 deadline for identi- -- filing exhibits for hearing,
- 15 which is January 3rd which would also be the date for
- 16 identifying cross-examination estimates, would the
- 17 expectation be that that would be on that same day?
- 18 MR. FUKANO: Commission Staff agrees, yes.
- 19 MS. SUETAKE: This is Public Counsel. That
- 20 was my understanding as well.
- JUDGE DOYLE: We're in agreement, then?
- MR. SHERR: Yeah, we are. Thank you.
- 23 JUDGE DOYLE: I will confirm that the
- 24 parties' proposed schedule works for the Commission and
- 25 incorporate it into the prehearing conference order.

- 1 Finally, regarding filing and service, I
- 2 want to remind the parties that documents should be
- 3 filed online through the electronic filing link on the
- 4 Commission's web page. Also the Commission's rules
- 5 provide for electronic service of documents. The
- 6 Commission will service -- will serve the parties
- 7 electronically and the parties will serve each other
- 8 electronically. I will enter a prehearing conference
- 9 order with details on this topic.
- 10 If you have any corrections or updates to
- 11 our master service list in this docket, please file a
- 12 written notice of appearance or email me at
- 13 samantha.doyle@utc.wa.gov.
- Is there anything else we need to address
- 15 today?
- MR. FUKANO: Nothing further from Commission
- 17 Staff.
- 18 MS. SUETAKE: Nothing further from Public
- 19 Counsel.
- JUDGE DOYLE: Okay.
- 21 MS. CORTEZ: Nothing from the Military
- 22 Department.
- MR. SHERR: Nothing from CenturyLink.
