Dear Commissioners:

Please find the enclosed petitions signed by 163 people asking Scott Morris, CEO of Avista Corp. and Mayo Schmidt, CEO of Hydro One, to address our concerns regarding the Colstrip generation plant. 74 individuals signed electronically. The report of those signatures is enclosed. 89 people signed paper petitions. Copies are enclosed. We have crossed-out names which were duplicated. Please include this petition as public comment regarding Docket # U-170970.

People began signing this petition before the proposed settlement agreement was released. One of the concerns addressed in this petition relates to setting aside funds for Colstrip community transition, which is included in the settlement. Please record these signatories as people who support the transition funds included in the settlement.

While the signatories request an end of rate payer funding for Colstrip by 2025, the settlement agreement commits to recovering the cost of Colstrip Units 3 and 4 by 2027. The settlement agreement thereby supports the petitioners' goal of ending rate payer funding of Colstrip.

We signatories further ask that funds for cleaning-up the environmental damage caused by Colstrip generation plan be set aside now. This remains a concern, as it is not addressed in the settlement agreement.
