- Q. Please state your name and business address.
- A. My name is Matt Steuerwalt, and my business address is Puget Sound Energy,P.O. Box 97034, Bellevue, Washington 98009-9734.
- Q. By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
- A. I am employed by Puget Sound Energy ("PSE" or "the Company") as Senior Vice

 President of External Affairs.
- Q. What are your duties as Senior Vice President of External Affairs for PSE?
- A. I lead PSE's efforts to engage with policymakers, communities, regulators, and the general public.
- Q. Briefly describe your education and relevant employment experience.
- A. I began my role as Senior Vice President of External Affairs for Puget Sound

 Energy in 2023. Prior to that, I have held positions in which I worked on complex
 policy issues in the public and private sectors for more than two decades.

 Immediately prior to joining PSE, I worked at Insight Strategic Partners, a Seattlebased public affairs firm specializing in government relations, public policy and
 strategic communications. Prior to that, I served in senior policy roles for both
 Governor Jay Inslee and Governor Chris Gregoire. In between my service to the

two Governors, I was a senior vice president at Strategies 360, leading work in several states for a number of national and regional energy, technology and industrial manufacturing clients. I began my work in Washington state as a policy advisor in the Office of the Attorney General.

I am a graduate of the University of California at San Diego, and I hold a master's degree in public administration from the Evans School at the University of Washington, where I also teach.

Q. Do you have experience with energy issues in Washington and the region?

A. Yes. During my time at the Attorney General's Office I worked on RTO West, the initial effort to create a west-wide market. I supported the Washington Attorney General's intervention in the FERC proceedings dealing with the California and larger west-wide market failures in the early 2000s and the subsequent multistate antitrust investigations and settlements (for which I led the *cy pres* distribution of benefits to Washington consumers). I represented Washington in the development of the Western Climate Initiative, the initial regional carbon market. I supervised Governor Inslee's policy team, including the energy and climate advisors, from 2014-2017.

In private practice, I have worked for multiple utilities including PSE and Chelan PUD, advised Hydro One on its attempted acquisition of Avista, and worked for renewable energy developers, oil and gas companies, renewable fuel companies, and solar panel manufacturers. In addition, I worked for TransAlta to negotiate

the agreement to shut the Centralia coal plant and secure legislation in support of that agreement.

Q. What is your experience with this Commission?

A. From 1997 to 2004 I worked for the Public Counsel section of the Attorney
General's Office. During that time, I worked on every electric and natural gas
general rate case and testified in support of settlement in many of those
proceedings. I worked on telecommunications policy and pricing proceedings.
Additionally, I worked on every merger and acquisition of an energy or
telecommunications company that came before the Commission during those
years and testified in support of settlement of some of those cases.
