- 1 NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket UG-060518 involves a request by Avista Corporation for authority to implement a mechanism to decouple its rates for conducting business operations, in part, from its rates for commodity sales.
- 2 CONFERENCE. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington on November 2, 2006, before Administrative Law Judge C. Robert Wallis at the request of parties to consider proposed agreed schedule changes to accommodate a multiparty settlement.
- 3 APPEARANCES. David Meyer, attorney, Spokane, Washington, represents Avista Corporation (Avista). Simon ffitch, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represents the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of the Attorney General (Public Counsel). Greg Trautman, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff). Ron Roseman, attorney, Seattle, represents intervenor The Energy Project. Nancy Glaser, Seattle, represents Intervenor The Northwest Energy Coalition, and Chad Stokes, attorney Portland, represents Intervenor Northwest Industrial Gas Users, or NWIGU.

- 4 **MULTIPARTY SETTLEMENT.** All parties except Public Counsel and The Energy Project have settled their differences and propose a settlement of all issues. Public Counsel and The Energy Project oppose the proposal.
- 5 PROPOSED SCHEDULE. The parties recognize that the process for reviewing a settlement differs from that for reviewing a fully contested filing. A settlement review is conducted pursuant to WAC 480-07-740 in which proponents and opponents of the proposal present evidence and argument, and the Commission determines whether to accept or reject the proposal, or to identify conditions necessary for its acceptance.¹
- 6 **PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE.** The parties suggest a schedule for presentation of evidence supporting the settlement proposal that includes prefiling of supporters' evidence; prefiling of opponents' evidence; and prefiling of rebuttal, followed by one day of hearing.

7 DISCOVERY. The discovery rules, WAC 480-07-400 through 425, have been invoked. The parties have agreed to three-business-day turn-around on discovery requests made after the submission of proponents' direct testimony on November 3, 2006. It is understood that exceptionally high volume of requests, or exceptionally demanding requests, or exceptional circumstances faced by the responding party, might pose a barrier to timely completion of answers—if that occurs, parties facing the difficulties must promptly consult with the requesting party and attempt to reach accommodation.

¹ Public Counsel suggested that the Commission might have options beyond those identified in the rule; as the observation was a comment, not a motion, and as the matter is speculative at this time, we do not make any ruling.

² The Commission may ask the parties to present argument or memoranda on points of interest.

- 8 **NOTICE OF HEARING.** The Commission will hold an evidentiary hearing in this matter beginning **9:30 a.m., December 5, 2006,** in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S. W., Olympia, Washington.
- 9 NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE. The Commission will convene a prehearing conference in this matter on December 4, 2006, at 9:30 a.m. in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S. W., Olympia, Washington to mark exhibits, including exhibits on cross examination, if any, and to address any procedural matters that the parties may present. If no matters warrant attention, the conference will be cancelled.
- 10 ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION MODE. The parties requested leave, and it was granted, for submission of filings in electronic format, with documents to be received in the Commission's records center by 9:00 a.m. on the following day. Documents will be considered timely filed if they meet these standards. *NOTE:* documents must reach the Commission, in their entirety, no later than 3:00 p.m. of the date of the deadline to allow for internal distribution and copying, as needed. Documents arriving after that time, in whole or in part, may be rejected.
- 11 NOTICE TO PARTIES. Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review. Parties must provide courtesy copies of filings to the presiding administrative law judge.
