

Concerning the petition for the closure of a highway-rail grade crossing, Barnhart - Railroad Milepost 62.40, the Yakama Nation Land Enterprise objects to this proposal.

This crossing is located on Tribal Trust Allotment No. T-614 of the Yakama Nation and is used extensively by Tribal members. There are seven homes located within a quarter mile of the railroad crossing.

Local farmers have utilized the railroad crossing over the years and continue to need to utilize it to move their farm machinery from field to field during their annual crop seasons.

Also, the Satus Longhouse is located on Barnhart Road and Yakama Tribal members who attend religious ceremonies, feast ceremonies, funeral ceremonies, and other cultural events would be greatly affected by the crossing closure. These cultural ceremonies are an important part of the Yakama Tribal customs and the proposed closure would cut off access to the Satus Longhouse.

Our objection to the petition for the closure is based upon the reasons provided above and we believe these to be justifiable reasons.

Dear Mr. Danner:

It recently came to the attention of the Yakama Nation Tribal Council that petitions were filed by Yakima County to the Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) for the closure of two highway-rail crossings on the Yakama Reservation. The petitions for Barnhart Road (docket #121648) and N Stevens Road (docket #121647), were received by your office on October 12, 2012.

At this time, Yakama Nation cannot support these actions and objects to the closure of the above said roads. Yakama Nation requests that UTC and Yakima County delay any further actions on the said petitions until a meeting with Yakama Tribal Council occurs.

These actions can result in substantial impacts to the social welfare of tribal members living in the area and ceremonial activities at the Satus Longhouse. We realize safety is an issue associated with the proposed closure, but limiting access may have profound consequences as well. Emergency response to tribal homes in the area could be significantly impacted. The Satus Longhouse located at the intersection of Satus Longhouse and Drainbank Roads is better served by the Barnhart Road access to and from SR 22 during ceremonial activities.
