5	JUDGE PEARSON: Let's be on the record.
6	We are here for a settlement hearing in
7	Consolidated Dockets UW-143181 and UW-143330, both of
8	which are captioned Washington Utilities and
9	Transportation Commission versus Newaukum Water
10	System, Inc. I am Rayne Pearson, I am the
11	administrative law judge presiding over today's
12	proceeding, which is a settlement hearing requested by
13	the parties. Today is Monday, March 23rd, 2015, and
14	the time is approximately 10:00 a.m.
15	Let's get started by taking short appearances
16	from the parties, beginning with Commission Staff.
17	MR. SHEARER: Good morning. My name is
18	Brett Shearer, Assistant Attorney General, on behalf
19	of Commission Staff.
20	JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
21	And for the Company.
22	MR. KURTZ: Maurice Kurtz, Chairman of
23	the Board, Newaukum Water, Incorporated.
24	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
25	So both Staff and the Company will have the

- 1 opportunity to give brief opening statements in
- 2 support of the settlement agreement this morning, and
- 3 then I will ask if there is anyone else, either in the
- 4 room or on the bridge line, who wishes to briefly
- 5 comment on the settlement agreement.
- 6 Mr. Shearer, you can begin when you are ready.
- 7 MR. SHEARER: Thank you, Your Honor.
- 8 Staff has very little to add. We feel the settlement
- 9 agreement, proposed settlement agreement, is a fair,
- 10 just, reasonable result in this case. The parties did
- 11 request for this hearing, just based on the
- 12 third-party commentary, the significant amounts of
- 13 third-party commentary that we received over the
- 14 course of the case. Everybody thought it would be
- 15 beneficial to have kind of one last opportunity for
- any of those third parties to be heard.
- 17 Staff is here today to answer any clarifying
- questions about the agreement you may have or any
- other parties may have. Our witness is Mr. Jim Ward.
- 20 He is available for questions.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
- 22 Mr. Kurtz.
- MR. KURTZ: I really don't have much to
- 24 add to that. I would say that Newaukum Water and the
- 25 UTC Staff have agreed to the settlement that is being

- 1 put in front of you for signature.
- 2 That's all I have.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
- 4 So are there others who wish to speak briefly
- 5 today on the settlement agreement?
- If I could get a show of hands, I guess, to
- 7 begin.
- 8 This one, you're not here to speak?
- 9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No, I'm just a
- 10 member of the Board.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. All right.
- 12 Can you tell me your name again, sir?
- MR. KELLEY: My name is Henry Kelley.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Henry Kelley, okay.
- And do we have anyone on the bridge line
- 16 today?
- 17 Okay. Hearing nothing, I think, Mr. Kelley,
- 18 you might be the only one. If you would like to step
- over to this table and turn on the microphone, I will
- 20 swear you in.
- MR. KELLEY: Which one?
- 22 JUDGE PEARSON: Right here at the end is
- 23 fine.
- MR. KELLEY: (Complies.)
- JUDGE PEARSON: And if you press the

1 button --2 MR. KELLEY: Okay. 3 JUDGE PEARSON: -- when the red light 4 comes on, that lets you know that the microphone is 5 working. 6 Okay. If you would stand and please raise your right hand, I will swear you in. 8 HENRY KELLEY, witness herein, having been 9 10 first duly sworn on oath, was 11 examined and testified as follows: 12 13 JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you. 14 MR. KELLEY: You know, I came down here as a ratepayer on the water system. I chose not to 15 16 associate with Mr. Lindebak for -- based on experience 17 with him. JUDGE PEARSON: Can I just stop you for 18 19 one second? Could you state and spell your last name for the court reporter before you begin? 20 21 MR. KELLEY: Kelley, K-E-L-L-E-Y. 22 JUDGE PEARSON: And your first name is 23 Henry? 24 MR. KELLEY: Yes.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. You can continue.

- 1 MR. KELLEY: Thank you.
- 2 It has been very interesting to watch the
- 3 process unfold. It has been educational. I would
- 4 like to compliment the people that I dealt with, which
- 5 was Jim Ward and Brett Shearer, for the job they have
- done, and that they kept things at a low level, low
- 7 key, I guess, and were very available.
- 8 I am -- I guess I am just saying I am glad
- 9 that the system worked and that ratepayers will no
- 10 longer be paying Ken Lindebak's debts for him.
- JUDGE PEARSON: What was the last thing
- 12 you said?
- MR. KELLEY: Well, I was saying --
- JUDGE PEARSON: Ratepayers will no
- 15 longer be paying what?
- MR. KURTZ: Ken Lindebak's debts for
- 17 him.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Oh, okay.
- 19 MR. KELLEY: You know, I am also
- 20 grateful to Mr. Kurtz for the job that he is doing as
- 21 assistant manager. It's not an easy job by any means.
- 22 I don't envy him the task he has, but I compliment him
- for the job he has done.
- I think that's all I have to say.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
