5	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. We will be on the
6	record. The time is approximately 10:12 a.m. We were
7	initially scheduled to begin at 9:30, but we do have a late
8	start due to Mr. Harrison's availability. Mr. Harrison is
9	here with us now.
10	So this is a hearing in Docket No. UW-180886, in the
11	matter of the Commission's complaint for penalties against
12	Sunrise Acres Water Services, LLC and to enforce Order 02
13	entered in this docket on March 6th, 2019. The purpose of
14	this hearing is to determine whether Sunrise Acres violated
15	Order 02; and if so, what the proper penalty should be for
16	the violation.
17	My name is Nelli Doroshkin, and I'm the administrative
18	law judge presiding over this proceeding.
19	So we will begin by taking appearances from the parties
20	beginning with Commission Staff.
21	MR. FUKANO: Good morning, Judge Doroshkin. I'm
22	Harry Fukano, Assistant Attorney General with the Utilities
23	and Transportation Commission, and I'm here on behalf of
24	Commission Staff.
25	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Harrison, could you please

Page 39 state and spell your first and last name? 1 2 MR. HARRISON: Tom Harrison, H-A-R-R-I-S-O-N. 3 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And is there anyone else 4 in the hearing room or on the bridge line who would also like to give an appearance? (No response.) No? Okay. So as noted earlier, this is a hearing initiated by the 6 Commission alleging that Sunrise Acres violated Order 02 issued in this docket. If we determine today that a 8 violation has occurred, then we may assess a penalty for 9 this violation. 10 Staff will present its case first. And Mr. Harrison, 11 12 you'll have an opportunity to ask the Staff witness 13 questions based on what the Staff witness has said. 14 that, you'll be able to present your case and testify regarding your compliance with Order 02, and then Mr. Fukano 15 16 will have the chance to ask you questions. 17 So Staff will present its case first. And Mr. Fukano, 18 you may make any preliminary remarks and call your first 19 witness. 20 MR. FUKANO: Thank you. 21 Under RCW 80.04.380, every public service company and 22 all officers, agents, employees -- and employees are 23 required to obey, observe, and comply with every order made by the Commission so long as such order remains in effect. 24

On March 6, 2019, the Commission issued Order 2 in

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1	Docket 180886, which required Sunrise Acres to either file a
2	water company tariff or a sale agreement documenting that
3	Tom Harrison no longer owns the company. Staff intends to
4	show through its witness, Susie Paul, that Sunrise Acres has
5	failed to comply with this condition of Order 2, and
6	requests the Commission impose appropriate penalties.
7	And I'd like to call Susie Paul.
8	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Do you swear or affirm the
9	testimony you give today is the truth and the whole truth?
10	THE WITNESS: Yes.
11	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Thank you.
12	MR. FUKANO: And permission to approach
13	Mr. Harrison just to distribute
14	(Mr. Harrison's cell phone
15	makes sounds.)
16	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Yes.
17	Mr. Harrison, could you also please silence your cell
18	phone? I don't know if you just turned off a call, but if
19	you could turn off the sound entirely.
20	MR. HARRISON: Okay.
21	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Thank you.
22	MR. HARRISON: I keep getting calls from the
23	water company, so

- 1 EXAMINATION
- 2 BY MR. FUKANO:
- 3 Q Would you please state your name and spell your last name for
- 4 the record?
- 5 A My name is Susie Paul, and my last name is P-A-U-L.
- 6 Q Please state the name of your employer.
- 7 A I'm employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation
- 8 Commission.
- 9 O And what is your position with the Commission?
- 10 A I'm a compliance investigator.
- 11 Q And how long have you been in that position?
- 12 A I've been with the Commission since April of 2013.
- 13 Q And what qualifications do you have for that position?
- 14 A I am -- I have a bachelor's degree in criminal justice, and
- 15 I've been an investigator with the regulatory industry for
- 16 14, 15 years, approximately. I'm a certified Washington
- 17 State investigator, and I've taken the required training,
- 18 core and advance training for investigators.
- 19 Q I would now like to discuss the matter at issue in today's
- hearing.
- 21 Are you familiar with Sunrise Acres?
- 22 A Yes, I am.
- 23 O And how are you familiar with Sunrise Acres?
- 24 A I was the investigator assigned to Sunrise Acres.
- 25 Q Have you previously participated in a hearing involving

- 1 Sunrise Acres?
- 2 A Yes.
- 3 Q And what hearing was that?
- 4 A That was a classification hearing to determine whether or not
- 5 Sunrise Acres was a water company that falls under Commission
- 6 jurisdiction.
- 7 Q And I am showing you what has been previously labeled as
- 8 proposed Exhibit SP-3.
- 9 MR. FUKANO: And there are two copies at the
- bench for the judge and records.
- 11 A Okay.
- 12 Q (By Mr. Fukano) What is this exhibit?
- 13 A This is Order 02, which is an initial order classifying
- Sunrise Acres as a water company and requiring the company to
- file an initial tariff or a sale agreement.
- 16 Q And are you familiar with this exhibit?
- 17 A Yes, I am.
- 18 Q Would you please turn to page 6 of SP-3.
- 19 A Okay, I'm there.
- 20 Q What does paragraph 23 say?
- 21 A It says, by April 8th, 2019, Sunrise Acres Water Services,
- 22 LLC must file with the Commission either a tariff pursuant to
- the requirements set out in WAC 480-110-433 or,
- 24 alternatively, a sale agreement documenting that Tom Harrison
- no longer owns Sunrise Acres Water Services, LLC.

- 1 MR. FUKANO: And I would ask the judge to take
- official notice of this exhibit pursuant to WAC 480-07-495.
- JUDGE DOROSHKIN: I will take official notice. I
- 4 will not be admitting the document as an exhibit.
- 5 Q (By Mr. Fukano) Ms. Paul, I am showing you what has been
- 6 labeled as proposed Exhibit SP-2. What is this exhibit?
- 7 A This is a declaration -- my declaration concerning Sunrise
- 8 Acres Water Services.
- 9 O And are you familiar with this exhibit?
- 10 A Yes. I wrote this declaration.
- 11 Q And why -- for what purpose did you create this declaration?
- 12 A I'm going to glance over it really quick. (Perusing.)
- 13 This declaration was written because Sunrise Acres had
- failed to meet the order that was set out for Mr. Harrison to
- either file a tariff or produce a sale agreement.
- 16 Q And what does paragraph 5 of SP-2 state?
- 17 A It states that on April 23rd, 2019, I contacted Mr. Harrison
- 18 by telephone and inquired about the status of a tariff or
- 19 sale agreement filed at the Commission. Mr. Harrison stated
- 20 that they were out of town and as a result he could not file
- 21 the sale agreement. I explained to Mr. Harrison that he is
- the current owner of Sunrise Acres and that he would need to
- file a tariff in the absence of a sale agreement. I also
- 24 explained the severity of not complying with a Commission
- order and that it may result in enforcement action, to

Page 44 1 include assessed penalties. Mr. Harrison said that he would 2 get to it next week. 3 I would move to admit SP-2. MR. FUKANO: JUDGE DOROSHKIN: So there is already an exhibit 5 designated as SP-2 filed in this docket. 6 MR. FUKANO: I see. May it be redesignated as 7 SP-2B? 8 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Why don't you -- can we 9 redesignate this as SP-4? Let's do that instead. 10 MR. FUKANO: Very good. 11 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And then, Mr. Harrison, do you 12 have any objection to the admission of this exhibit? 13 MR. HARRISON: No. 14 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. So then it is admitted 15 as SP-4. 16 (Exhibit SP-4 admitted.) 17 (By Mr. Fukano) Ms. Paul, as of this hearing, do you know 18 whether Sunrise Acres has filed either a water company tariff 19 or a sale agreement documenting that Tom Harrison no longer 20 owned Sunrise Acres? 21 As of this morning when I checked with records, a sale Α 22 agreement nor a tariff has been filed. 23 Thank you. 24 MR. FUKANO: No further questions. 25 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Harrison, do you have any

Page 45 questions for Ms. Paul? 1 2 MR. HARRISON: No. 3 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Mr. Harrison, you'll now 4 have the opportunity to speak. Is anyone else going to be speaking on behalf of Sunrise Acres? 5 MR. HARRISON: Just myself. 6 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. So let's swear you in. 8 Please stand and raise your right hand. 9 Do you swear or affirm that the testimony you give today is the truth and the whole truth? 10 MR. HARRISON: Yes, I do. 11 12 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Thank you. 13 You may go ahead and speak as to Sunrise Acres 14 compliance with Order 02 and whether any penalties should be 15 assessed. 16 MR. HARRISON: Okay. I'm still in the process. 17 One of the purchasers is in Ireland and the other one is in 18 They haven't got their act together. I gave them 19 all the pertinent profit and loss statements, and that was 20 two or three weeks ago. I'm still in limbo, so I've just got to face the Court, 21 22 as -- as you may, you know. Whether I start the process and 23 they complete the sale, I don't -- I don't know which will come first. 24 25 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Fukano, do you have any

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1	questions for Mr. Harrison?
2	MR. FUKANO: Not at this time.
3	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And then, Mr. Harrison,
4	have you looked into the possibility of filing a tariff?
5	MR. HARRISON: I have. I can start that process,
6	but I was hoping to complete the sale. It's hard to sell a
7	little 39-unit water company. Not too many purchasers are
8	looking for it, so The other possibility is just to give
9	it to the Sunrise Acres people.
10	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And how long do you anticipate
11	filing a tariff would take?
12	MR. HARRISON: Well, I can start the process. It
13	just seemed futile at first, you know, but I didn't think
14	they were going to take this long.
15	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: So when would you anticipate
16	closing on a sale?
17	MR. HARRISON: Well, I talked to them on the way
18	over, and that's when I found out that the financial guy is
19	in Ireland, you know, on a vacation. They didn't tell me
20	that was going on. You know, so I thought we could get it
21	done before, you know, I got here, but that's not the case.
22	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And so this phone call
23	you had, is this a final step in the sale process? Where in
24	the sale process are you now?
25	MR. HARRISON: Yes, they were they were

Page 47 1 supposed to go over the financials and write an agreement 2 with me. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And so, do you have 4 any --MR. HARRISON: I have no papers at all since the last time he was here with me. 6 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: So you have no documentation of the sale as --8 9 MR. HARRISON: I do not. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Any documentation of the 10 11 negotiations? 12 MR. HARRISON: No, besides the fact I've given 13 them all of my information, you know, financial-wise, you 14 know, to Mr. Christensen. 15 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And how long would it take to 16 file a tariff? 17 MR. HARRISON: I -- I would have to refer to the Commission. 18 19 Do you know how long it takes to start the process and 20 file it? You know, a couple weeks? 21 MS. PAUL: Well, that's really a question for 22 Regulatory Services, but it would have to be approved. 23 could be a month. I really don't know how long the process 24 would take. 25 We went through this with Mr. Harrison last time we

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1	were in the hearing room to start the process, and that has		
2	not started yet.		
3	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: All right. That's all the		
4	questions I had for you, Mr. Harrison.		
5	I did have one		
6	MR. FUKANO: Would it be possible to take a brief		
7	recess to discuss the matter with Staff?		
8	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay.		
9	MR. FUKANO: Thank you. It will probably be no		
10	more than five minutes.		
11	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay.		
12	(Recess taken from 10:26 a.m. to		
13	10:34 a.m.)		
14	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And we will be back on the		
15	record.		
16	First, I would like to ask Staff to submit a new		
17	exhibit list with the updated designation. So this is		
18	exhibit proposed SP-2, and we are redesignating it as		
19	SP-3, not SP-4. I just want to correct that.		
20	(Exhibit SP-4 redesignated as		
21	Exhibit SP-3.)		
22	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And I understand that during		
23	the recess there was a discussion between Staff and		
24	Mr. Harrison regarding the timing of a tariff filing?		
25	MR. FUKANO: Not between Mr. Harrison but between		

Page 49 myself and Staff. 1 2 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. 3 MR. FUKANO: And Staff has informed me that an order to file a tariff would only take a matter of days, but 4 while the process itself might take up as long as 30 days, as identified by Ms. Paul. So the filing could be done 6 relatively rapidly, although the approval may take a bit 8 more time. 9 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. 10 MR. FUKANO: Staff has prepared a template water company tariff that it has provided to Mr. Harrison, and it 11 12 would be willing to provide it again to assist in that 13 effort. 14 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. 15 And Ms. Paul, you can testify to that? 16 MS. PAUL: Yes, Mr. Harrison was provided a 17 template, and we can do that again. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. All right. And then one 18 19 more question for you. Do you have a recommended penalty 20 amount? 21 MS. PAUL: Yes. 22 MR. FUKANO: Staff's recommended penalty would 23 be, given that the violation has run for 65 days and each day may constitute a separate violation, Staff would propose 24 25 an imposed penalty of \$5,000, with an additional 25,000

Page 50 suspended. 1 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And that's from the date of 2 3 April 8th through...? MR. FUKANO: 4 This day. Through this day? 5 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Fukano, would you like to summarize Staff's 6 recommendations? 8 MR. FUKANO: Yes. 9 Under RCW 80.04.380, every public service company and all officers, agents, and employees of any public service 10 company shall obey, observe, and comply with every order, 11 12 rule, direction or requirement made by the Commission under authority of this Title, Title 80, so long as the same shall 13 14 be and remain in force. 15 That same statute states that a public service company 16 that fails to obey a Commission order is subject to a 17 penalty of up to \$1,000 for each offense, and that each day, in the instance of a continuing violation, shall constitute 18 19 a separate offense. In Order 2, the Commission ordered Sunrise Acres to 20 either file a water company tariff or a sale agreement 21 22 documenting that Tom Harrison no longer owns Sunrise Acres 23 by April 8th, 2019. As of today, June 12th, Sunrise Acres has failed to comply with Order 2 for 65 days. 24 25 Staff requests that Commission impose Staff's requested

Page 51 1 penalty for failure to comply with Order 2, and that 2 Sunrise Acres be ordered to file a water company tariff as 3 soon as by the end of this week. Staff would also submit that a sale at this time of a water company having been classified in Order 2, Sunrise Acres, that is, would be subject to RCW 80.12.020, 6 which may subject the sale of a water company, depending on 8 who it is being sold to or what entity it is being sold to, 9 to Commission approval. And so Staff would also suggest that a potential sale at this time would be subject to 10 11 further Commission approval depending on who the sale is to. 12 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And Mr. Harrison, do you have any final remarks that you'd like to make, particularly 13 14 in regard to the proposed penalty and the Staff's testimony regarding the filing of the tariff, the timing of the 15 16 filing? 17 I guess not, because the severity MR. HARRISON: 18 is way more than what the little company is worth. 19 know, it only has \$4,000 in a checking account. 20 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Thank you, Mr. Harrison. So I will take this matter under advisement and issue 21 22 an order. 23 Is there anything else ? MR. FUKANO: Just to clarify, how would you -- or 24 25 when would you like the revised exhibit list filed by?
