Page 3 FEBRUARY 22, 2022 1 2 1:30 p.m. * * * * 3 4 JUDGE O'CONNELL: Good afternoon. The time is 5 approximately 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, February 22, 2022. My name is Andrew O'Connell. I'm an administrative law 6 7 judge with the Washington Utilities and Transportation 8 Commission, and I am presiding in this matter. 9 We're here today for a second virtual prehearing conference in Docket UG-210745 which concerns a complaint 10 filed by Tree Top Inc. against Cascade Natural Gas 11 12 Corporation. Today's conference is being held for the purpose of discussing procedural next steps including a 13 procedural schedule. 14 15 Let's move forward with appearances. Short 16 appearances will be sufficient, beginning with counsel 17 for Tree Top. MR. STOKES: Good afternoon, Your Honor. 18 19 Chad Stokes, counsel for Tree Top with the Cable 20 Huston Law Firm. 21 JUDGE O'CONNELL: And for Cascade? 22 MS. PEASE: Good afternoon, Your Honor. 23 This is Jocelyn Pease with McDowell Rackner Gibson for Cascade. 24 25 JUDGE O'CONNELL: First let me ask what

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Page 4 discussions, if any, the parties have had regarding 1 2 procedural next steps and the procedural schedule. 3 Mr. Stokes? MR. STOKES: I'll jump in here, Your Honor. 4 5 I believe we have an agreed upon schedule. So we've been talking about a schedule. And I think we have 6 7 something to read to the court at this point, if you're 8 ready. 9 JUDGE O'CONNELL: Yes, I am. If you're both 10 ready. 11 MR. STOKES: Okay. 12 JUDGE O'CONNELL: Okay. Go ahead. 13 So obviously the prehearing MR. STOKES: conference is today. Tree Top will file its opening 14 testimony on April 8th. We will have a settlement 15 16 conference on April 26th. Cascade will file its rebuttal testimony on May 12th. Tree Top will file its reply 17 18 testimony on 5/27. There will be a hearing, if necessary, on 6/22, if that works for the Commission. 19 Post-hearing briefs simultaneous on July 13th. And 20 response briefs on 7/27. 21 22 JUDGE O'CONNELL: Now, Mr. Stokes, you 23 mentioned the hearing, if necessary. Do the parties --24 is that just down to the settlement conference if the 25 parties are -- if you do work out a settlement?

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Page 5 Or are the parties thinking that there might not 1 be a need for a live hearing? 2 3 MR. STOKES: I think -- well, I'll only speak for Tree Top. 4 5 In my experience, sometimes once you have the testimony on file, there are no contested issues and it's 6 7 just a matter for the Commission to decide. 8 So we'll have to see what the testimony provides and see if there's going to be cross-examination that's 9 10 necessary. So we always kind of view that as something 11 you see at the time. 12 MS. PEASE: And, I guess, Your Honor, one other point that I would make is we would, of course, be 13 available if the Commission were to have questions and 14 want to have a hearing, even if the parties didn't seek 15 16 cross-examination. 17 JUDGE O'CONNELL: Good point. Thank you. 18 Okay. Let me quickly tentatively unofficially 19 look for whether June 22nd is available for the 20 Commission. 21 Have you inquired about that date already, Mr. Stokes? 22 MR. STOKES: I have not, Your Honor. 23 Ι 24 apologize. I probably should have done that before this 25 call.

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Page 6 I'm asking you because 1 JUDGE O'CONNELL: No. 2 it looks like the one day among a sea of full days where 3 the Commission is completely free. Sometimes you get lucky. 4 MR. STOKES: 5 JUDGE O'CONNELL: All right. Ms. Pease, do you want to be heard at all about the schedule? 6 Cascade has conferred with counsel 7 MS. PEASE: 8 for Tree Top on the schedule and agrees to the schedule 9 proposed by Mr. Stokes. JUDGE O'CONNELL: Okay. I've also had my 10 11 questions I planned on asking answered already. 12 Is there -- well, let me say, first, I will confirm that that date for the hearing works for the 13 Commission. And if it does, I will approve the 14 procedural schedule that's been agreed and presented. 15 16 And I will memorialize it in a second prehearing conference order shortly after the hearing today. It may 17 18 be tomorrow or the next day. 19 Is there anything else that we should discuss? Is there any other issue for the parties? 20 21 MR. STOKES: Yes, Your Honor. 22 So the parties have contemplated discovery that may be needed. But we'll try to work informally. 23 24 But we also want to build in a protective order 25 in case anyone asks for information that's confidential.

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Page 7 JUDGE O'CONNELL: And, Ms. Pease, this is --1 2 well, let me direct the question to both Ms. Pease and 3 Mr. Stokes. 4 Who is the confidentiality order protecting? Is 5 it the company? MR. STOKES: I think it would be both. 6 7 Because, I mean, what Tree Top would be concerned about 8 is customer specific information that they would be asked for. So, you know, production, quotas, and, you know, 9 volumes, and that sort of thing. So we'd want to -- I 10 mean, there's certain information that's already public. 11 12 But to the extent you get into -- once you ask the question, we just want to make sure if it's sensitive 13 14 that we can protect it. 15 MS. PEASE: I would agree with that, Your 16 Honor. 17 I would -- I mean, we don't have the questions 18 before us yet. But would assume that the protections 19 would go both ways. 20 JUDGE O'CONNELL: Okay. So my understanding is the standard protective order that the Commission 21 22 usually issues will need to be updated for that situation so that both sides will be needing to sign. 23 Okay. And is there anything else from the parties? 24 25 MR. STOKES: Not from Tree Top.

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Page 8 MS. PEASE: And I don't think so from Cascade 1 2 either. 3 JUDGE O'CONNELL: Thank you. I -- we've covered everything I had planned to 4 cover. And thank you for bringing up the protective 5 6 I will issue a protective order as soon as order. 7 possible that will protect both sides. And then I will issue a second prehearing conference order. 8 9 So without anything else, we will be adjourned. Thank you.
