Q. Please state your name and business address.

A. My name is Joey Henderson. My business address is 10885 NE Fourth Street, Bellevue, Washington, 98004-5591.

Q. By whom are you employed and in what capacity?

A. I am employed by Puget Sound Energy, Inc. (“PSE”) as CT Compliance Program Manager.

Q. What are your duties as CT Compliance Program Manager?

A. As CT Compliance Program Manager, my duties include obtaining and maintaining air quality permits for various energy resources owned and operated by PSE. I participated in PSE’s acquisition of the Mint Farm Energy Center (“Mint Farm”) from Wayzata Opportunities Fund, LLC and Mint Farm Power LLC. Specifically, my duties related to PSE’s acquisition of Mint Farm included assessing air permitting compliance matters as part of the due diligence evaluation.

1 **Q. Briefly describe your education and relevant employment experience.**

2 A. I graduated from the University of Washington in 1995 with Bachelor of Arts
3 degrees in Business Administration and Environmental Studies.

4 From 1995 to 1997, I was a project manager for Pacific Specialty Construction,
5 Inc., in Seattle, Washington. From 1997 to 2000, I was a project manager in the
6 Environmental Services Department for Shannon & Wilson, Inc., also in Seattle.
7 From 2000 through 2007, I was an Environmental Manager in the Technical
8 Services Department for McFarland Cascade in Tacoma, Washington. As
9 Environmental Manager, I managed all environmental permits (air, wastewater,
10 stormwater) and coordinated with plant managers to maintain regulatory
11 compliance of operational wood treating plants. I developed Best Management
12 Practices to comply with regulations in the highly-regulated wood treating
13 industry. I also managed the cleanup of former wood treating sites, including
14 working with regulatory agencies to develop and implement the final cleanup
15 strategies. Additional duties as Environmental Manager included generating
16 regulatory reports and plant plans and manuals.

17 I joined PSE in 2007 as CT Compliance Program Manager. In addition to the
18 duties described above, I assist in the development of CT comprehensive strategy
19 formulation, work planning, programmatic implementation and technical support
20 for the Energy Resource Group's Thermal Assets. I assist in the development and
21 performance of strategies to promote compliance with established or anticipated
22 regulatory requirements and industry best practices for Operations training and

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procedural documentation initiatives. I also coordinate with appropriate internal departments, regulatory agencies and the community to facilitate compliance strategies.
