First of all, let me also check that 15 16 Commissioner Ann Rendahl and Commissioner Jay Balasbas are here tonight; is that correct? 17 COMMISSIONER BALASBAS: This is Commissioner 18 19 Balasbas, I am here. 20 Thank you, sir. CHAIR DANNER: COMMISSIONER RENDAHL: And this is 21 22 Commissioner Rendahl, I am also here. 23 CHAIR DANNER: All right. Great. 24 So, John, I'm going to turn it over to you, 25 If you can give us a little rundown, background then.

2 MR. CUPP: Yes, thank you, Chair Danner. 3 My name is John Cupp. I'm the public 4 involvement representative for the Utilities and 5 Transportation Commission. I'll kind of be the moderator this evening, and I kind of want to explain 6 7 how this hearing will proceed. 8 Little background on the case, Cascade Natural Gas filed a request last June to increase its 9 overall revenue by \$13.8 million or 5.3 percent. 10 The Company seeks to increase its overall rate of return to 11 12 7.54 percent and its return on equity to 10.3 percent. 13 If the Company's request is allowed as filed, the average customer using 56 therms per month 14 15 will see a monthly increase of \$2.68. Excuse me, \$2.86, 16 I'm sorry. 17 The UTC will hold an evidentiary hearing on 18 February 24th and 25th of this year, and any changes to 19 rates will go into effect no later than May 21st, 2021. 20 So tonight you will have the opportunity to provide your comments to the Commissioners pertaining to 21 22 this rate case. 23 Should I go on with this part, Chair Danner, 24 since we don't seem to have anyone? 25 CHAIR DANNER: I don't know if that's

I am hearing nobody, so, 8 Mr. Cupp, I think that you are completed, and thank 9 you -- you're complete. Thank you very much for those 10 comments. 11 Thank you. MR. CUPP: 12 CHAIR DANNER: So we make this opportunity available for customers to give us their thoughts about 13 the rate increase that has been requested by Cascade 14 Natural Gas. No customers have availed themselves of 15 16 this opportunity tonight, so we will adjourn shortly. Ι just want to make sure that there aren't any loose ends, 17 and what I'm thinking about is for Lisa Gafken, the 18 19 Public Counsel, or Ann Paisner, is there a good deadline, what is an appropriate deadline for us for 20 accepting public comments in this case? 21 Good evening. This is Ann 22 MS. PAISNER: 23 Paisner. I'm an assistant attorney general in the 24 Public Counsel Unit of the Washington State Attorney 25 General's Office. My understanding is that typically
