Moving Party.

Commission Staff hereby moves for an Order 1) requiring Olympic to refile its

Attachment proposed findings and conclusions in the same format as the brief; and 2) for
clarification regarding record citations and line format for the Reply Briefs.

Facts.

In its July 19, 2002 Prehearing Conference Order ("Order") at ¶ 13, the

Commission stated: "Parties must follow the briefing format in WAC 480-09-770." The

Commission required any Attachment proposed findings and conclusions to be presented in the same format as the brief itself. Order at ¶ 15.

Olympic's Attachment Proposed Findings and Conclusions to its Opening Brief are single spaced, *i.e.*, they are not presented in the same format as the brief itself.

At the July 18, 2002 prehearing conference, ALJ Wallis stated that for purposes of the post-hearing briefs, he preferred citations to the record be contained in the body of the briefs, and footnotes could be used for "parentheticals, citations to legal authority" or long string cites to the record in specific instances. (Tr. 5322:22 to 5323:19).

In Olympic's and Tesoro's Opening Briefs, virtually all citations to the record are contained in footnotes.

In addition, it appears that the Opening Brief of Olympic used the "Exactly" code for line spacing, not the "Double" space code. The "Exactly" code permits more lines per page of text than the "Double" space code.

Discussion.

All parties need to follow the same rules.

The Commission Order was clear that Attachment Findings and Conclusions be in the same format as the brief. Olympic did not comply. Other parties complied. Olympic needs to comply.

By contrast, the issues of a) line spacing; and b) placement of citations to the record, were not addressed by the Commission in its Order (although the latter issue was resolved on the record). Neither WAC 480-09-770 nor WAC 480-09-420 contain

guidance on either issue. Accordingly, the best we can do at this point is ask the Commission to be prescriptive on these two issues for the Reply Briefs.

Relief Sought.

Staff requests the Commission order Olympic to refile its Attachment Proposed Findings and Conclusions in the same format as its Opening Brief.

Staff requests the Commission rule, for Reply Briefs, that the predominant place for citations to the record is the body of the brief, and that the line spacing code should be "Double" space, not "Exactly."

Staff also requests expedited consideration of this motion, given the filing deadline for the Reply Briefs.
