A. APPLICABILITY

Foreign Exchange Service is offered to and from contiguous exchange areas for individual (i.e., one party) business or residence customers where facilities are available.

B. **DEFINITIONS**

The following definitions are applicable to service provided under this Schedule:

- 1. The exchange in which the telephone or termination receiving foreign exchange service is located is the "local exchange" and the company which operates the local exchange is the "Local Company". The exchange in which the central office facilities providing the foreign exchange service are located is the "serving exchange" and the company which operates the service exchange is the "Serving Company".
- Where the boundary of one exchange area coincides with the boundary of another exchange area, the exchanges are "contiguous exchanges" and the boundary between the two said exchanges is the "Common Boundary".
- 3. Foreign Exchange Service permits a customer in the local exchange to obtain service through the central office facilities of the Serving Company.

C. RATES

The monthly rate applicable for contiguous Foreign Exchange Service shall be the sum of the following three (3) elements:

E. <u>CONDITIONS</u>

- 1. The local utility will provide, own and maintain all lines between the premises on which the foreign exchange service station is located and the point of connection on the common boundary between the local and foreign exchanges.
- Foreign exchange service mileage charges are applicable to the route distance between the
 customer's primary station and the point on the common boundary of the foreign and local
 exchanges where connection is made with the lines of the customer, such point of connection
 to be determined by the involved utilities.
- Foreign exchange service will be furnished subject to the same conditions, as to the use of the service by others than the customer, as are applicable in connection with the class of service taken. Foreign exchange service will not be provided for public or semi-public uses.

- 5. Foreign Exchange Service will be listed in the directory of the serving company. Listings in the local exchange directory, additional listings, joint user or additional lines of information will be furnished at the rates in effect for the directory containing such listings.

Line extensions required in the local exchange to furnish Foreign Exchange Service will be constructed by this company upon payment by the applicant of the entire cost of constructing said extension, less three (3) times the estimated annual revenue to be derived by this company for service provided through the line extension.
- 7. Long distance message toll over foreign exchange channels will be charged for at the rate in effect for the class of call from the serving exchange.
