## Discussion

The partnership of Eric K. Holt, Zachary C. Holt, and Keith C. Holt (Holt & Holt) and Eric K. Holt, sole proprietor, filed joint application GA-79389 in docket TG-051203. GA-79389 is an application for transfer of all rights under Solid Waste Collection Certificate No. G-171 from Eric K. Holt, d/b/a Newman Lake Garbage Service, to Eric K. Holt, Zachary C. Holt, and Keith C. Holt (Holt & Holt), d/b/a Newman Lake Garbage Service. The application appeared on the Commission's August 15, 2005, application docket. No one filed a protest during the 30-day protest period. No one filed a petition to intervene.

Certificate No. G-171 authorizes garbage collection services in a portion of Spokane County. The application includes a copy of a partnership agreement signed March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2005. The business and affairs of the partnership are to be managed exclusively by Eric K. Holt.

Under the provisions of RCW 81.77.040, the Commission may grant an application with or without hearing when there is no existing certificate holder authorized to provide solid waste collection service in the territory requested. Further, any certificate may be sold, assigned, leased, transferred, or inherited as property, but only on authorization by the Commission.

## Recommendation
