DECLARATION OF SHERI HOYT

SHERI HOYT, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington, declares as follows:

- 1. I am over 18 years of age, a citizen of the United States, a resident of the state of Washington, and competent to be a witness.
- 2. I am employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) as a Compliance Specialist in the Business Practices Investigations Section. I have been employed at the Commission for over 13 years, holding various positions. As a Compliance Specialist, my responsibilities include conducting investigations regarding the business practices of regulated utility or transportation companies. As part of those duties, I investigate household goods companies that may be operating in violation of Commission statute, rule, or tariff.
- 3. On February 3, 2006, Metropolitan Movers, Inc. (Metropolitan) filed with the Commission an Application for Mitigation of Penalties (Mitigation Request) in Docket No. TV-052020. I have read the Mitigation Request.
- 4. This Mitigation Request arises from a Notice of Penalties Incurred and Due for Violations of Laws, Rules and Regulations issued by the Commission on January 30, 2006, in Docket No. TV-052020. In that Notice, the Commission issued a penalty of \$100.00 for a violation of WAC 480-15-480.
- 5. Before recommending the Commission issue penalties, as part of my job, I conducted an investigation of the Commission's records. My investigation resulted in an investigation report titled, "Staff Investigation Annual Report/Regulatory Fees." A true and accurate copy of that audit report is attached to this declaration as Attachment A.
- 6. I identified the violation in this case from records maintained by the Commission.

Specific Issue Addressed by Metropolitan in its Mitigation Request

Submitted Completed Report late on June 30, 2005

- 7. In its Mitigation Request, Metropolitan requests that the penalty be withdrawn because it claims it mailed the completed report and the proper regulatory fees on June 30, 2005.
- 8. Metropolitan stated it received the 2004 Annual Report forms timely and admits it did not complete and return the forms to the Commission by the due date of May 1, 2005. Metropolitan further stated it received a delinquency letter sent by the Commission in June, prompting it to complete and return the form with the regulatory fees on June 30, 2005.
- 9. Metropolitan stated it was not until it received the November 29, 2005, Complaint and Order to Show Cause Why Permit Should Not Be Canceled For Failure to Pay Regulatory Fees and/or Failure to File 2004 Annual Report and Notice of Hearing, that it was aware the Commission had not received the annual report and regulatory fee mailed on June 30, 2005. Metropolitan explained that it then retrieved the file from its year end storage and resubmitted a copy. The original check, number 28419, mailed to the Commission on June 30, 2005, was canceled and replaced with check 29260 for the original amount.
- 10. After receiving Metropolitan's Mitigation Request, I reviewed the Commission's records. I find no evidence of a 2004 annual report or payment of 2005 regulatory fees received prior to December 19, 2005. However, Metropolitan's annual report received by the Commission on December 19, 2005, is dated June 30, 2005. A copy of that annual report is attached to this declaration as Attachment B. The Regulatory Fee Calculation Schedule indicates one month of late fees were calculated at the time it was completed. Metropolitan submitted a regulatory fee of \$1,486.15 and \$44.58 to cover the late fees.
- 11. My review of Commission records indicates Metropolitan has not filed its annual report by the due date of May 1, in at least the previous nine years. A table demonstrating the history is attached to this declaration as Attachment C. Metropolitan failed to request an extension to file the annual report in any year except 2003, when it was granted two extensions to file beyond the May 1 deadline. The \$100.00 penalty assessed in Docket Number TV-052020 is the first time the company has been penalized for late filing its annual report.
- 12. I believe the company provided a credible explanation of the mitigating circumstances that led to the late filing in this case. For this reason, I support the company's request for full mitigation of the \$100.00 penalty.

Metropolitan Movers, Inc. – TV-052020 Staff Investigation - Annual Report/Regulatory Fees January 10, 2006

Purpose

The purpose of this investigation is to determine if Metropolitan Movers, Inc. (Metropolitan) is in violation of WAC 480-15-480 which requires household goods carriers to furnish annual reports to the Commission no later than May 1 each year.

Background

This investigation was prompted by Staff's yearly review of annual reports for household goods carriers registered in the state of Washington.

On March 3, 2005, the Commission mailed 2004 Annual Report forms and 2005 Regulatory Fee packets to household goods carriers in Washington State. A letter signed by Executive Secretary Carole Washburn instructed companies to file annual reports by May 1, 2005 (Appendix A). Companies requesting an extension were asked to do so prior to May 1, providing a reason for the requested extension.

On June 1, 2005, a letter signed by Carole Washburn was sent to each household goods carrier that had not filed an annual report by May 1, 2005 (Appendix B). The letter stated that Staff intended to recommend enforcement action, including possible penalties and/or suspension or revocation of authority to operate in Washington, for any company that failed to file a completed annual report by July 1, 2005.

Investigation

As of May 1, 2005, Metropolitan had not filed a 2004 annual report. The Commission mailed the company a letter on June 1, stating that Staff intended to recommend enforcement action, including possible penalties, for any company that failed to file a completed annual report. Metropolitan was advised that it must file the annual report no later than July 1, 2005, to avoid enforcement action.

In September 2005, Licensing Services Staff reviewed annual reports and regulatory fees for household goods carriers, compiled a list of companies that were out of compliance, and referred the matter to Business Practices Investigations.

On November 29, 2005, the Commission issued a Complaint and Order to Show Cause Why Permit Should Not be Cancelled for Failure to Pay Regulatory Fees and/or Failure to File 2004 Annual Report, and Notice of Hearing (Appendix C). Subsequently, Metropolitan filed the annual report on December 19, 2005.

The regulatory fee order and annual report forms are available on the Commission's web site at www.wutc.wa.gov. The Commission will also send a paper copy of the approved order and additional annual report forms upon request.

You must file your annual report and pay regulatory fees by May 1, 2005. Perfunctory extensions will not be granted. If you need an extension, please file prior to May 1, 2005, providing a reason for requesting an extension. In granting an extension, the Commission will consider whether application of the rule imposes undue hardship on the requesting person, different from hardships imposed on similarly situated persons per WAC 480-15-480.

Dear Regulated Household Goods Carrier:

Every Household Goods Carrier subject to regulation by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) is required by state law to file an annual report and pay regulatory fees by May 1* of each year. We mailed you the 2004 annual report form and 2005 regulatory fee calculation sheet on March 3, 2005. Our records indicate that you have not yet filed the completed annual report form and have not paid your regulatory fees for 2005.

You have already incurred a penalty of 2% of the total amount due for failure to pay your 2005 regulatory fees by May 1, 2005, and you will be charged interest at the rate of 1% per month on the delinquent balance until it is paid in full.

Commission staff also intends to recommend enforcement action, which may include penalties of up to \$100 per day and/or suspension or revocation of your authority to operate in Washington, against any household goods carrier that fails to file a completed annual report. In order to avoid this enforcement action, you must file your annual report as soon as possible, and no later than July 1, 2005.

COMPLAINT AND ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE WHY PERMIT SHOULD NOT BE CANCELED FOR FAILURE TO PAY REGULATORY FEES AND/OR FAILURE TO FILE 2004 ANNUAL REPORT; AND NOTICE OF HEARING (Set for December 19, 2005, 1:30 p.m.)

- Synopsis: The Commission orders twenty-two companies to show cause why their household goods carrier permits should not be canceled for failure to pay regulatory fees as required by RCW 81.80.321 and/or failure to file an annual report as required by RCW 81.04.080.
- Proceedings: The staff of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission Staff) distributes annual report forms to all household goods carrier permit holders, including Busby, Dan d/b/a Careful Movers (Careful Movers); Cascade Moving & Storage, Inc. (Cascade Moving); Cummings Moving Systems, LLC (Cummings Moving); Emad Kadem Al-Mosawi d/b/a Sunshine Movers (Sunshine Movers); Franz, Clara Marlene d/b/a Progressive Movers (Progressive Movers); G.J. Daniels, Inc. (G.J. Daniels); Harold Lemay Enterprises, Inc. (LeMay); Hutson, Charles Edward d/b/a Hutson & Sons Moving & Packing (Hutson Moving); W.W. Kassner d/b/a Industrial Transfer Co. (Industrial Transfer); Lincoln Moving & Storage Co., Inc. (Lincoln Moving); Lindsey, Jerry d/b/a Jerry Lindsey Excavating (Lindsey Excavating); Maskelyne Transfer & Storage, Inc. (Maskelyne Transfer); Maust Corp, The (Maust); Metropolitan Movers, Inc. (Metropolitan Movers); Pacific Northwest Motor Freight Lines, Inc. (Pacific Northwest); Pozzi Brothers Transportation, Inc. (Pozzi Brothers); Risk, Don C., Jr., d/b/a People Movers (People Movers); Sell, William L. (William Self); Specialty Moving, Inc. (Specialty Moving); Swan's Moving & Storage Co., Inc. (Swan's Moving); T & T Milk Transport, Inc. (T & T Milk); Washington Moving & Storage, Inc. (Washington Moving); (collectively "the Companies"). The annual report forms are sent to the address on record with the Commission for each permit holder. Each permit holder is required to submit an annual report and remit regulatory fees by May 1 of each year. A search of Commission records indicates that the Companies failed to comply with fee and/or reporting requirements required by RCW 81.80.321, RCW 81.04.080, and WAC 480-15-480. Thus, Commission Staff asks the Commission to order the Companies to come before it and show cause why the Commission should not

cancel each Company's permit for failure to pay regulatory fees and/or file annual reports.

I. COMPLAINT

- The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) on its own motion, and through its Staff, alleges as follows:
- 4 Household goods carriers are required to submit annual reports and remit regulatory fees to the Commission. *Title 81 RCW*.
- Household goods carriers are common carriers. See RCW 81.80.010; WAC 480-15 020. Every common carrier is a public service company. RCW 81.04.010.
- Public service companies must file an annual report with the Commission. RCW 81.04.080. Each common carrier must pay an annual regulatory fee of no more than one quarter of one percent of its gross income from intrastate operations for the previous calendar year. RCW 81.80.321. Thus, as common carriers transporting goods within the state of Washington, household goods carriers must pay regulatory fees and file annual reports.
- 7 Under Title 81 RCW, the Commission is expressly empowered to issue rules and regulations governing household goods carriers. See 81.04.160; WAC 480-15-010.
- The Commission distributes by mail annual report forms and instructions to each household goods permit holder at its address on record with the Commission. WAC 480-15-480.
- Annual reports and regulatory fees are due no later than May 1 of the year following the year being reported. WAC 480-15-480.

- The Commission may cancel a household goods carrier permit for good cause, including failure to submit an annual report or failure to pay regulatory fees.
 WAC 480-15-450.
- Busby, Dan d/b/a Careful Movers, is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Careful Movers holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Careful Movers failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Cascade Moving & Storage, Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Cascade Moving holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Cascade Moving failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Cummings Moving Systems, LLC, is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Cummings Moving holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Cummings Moving failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Bmad Kadem Al-Mosawi d/b/a Sunshine Movers is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Sunshine Movers holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Sunshine Movers failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Franz, Clara Marlene d/b/a Progressive Movers, is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Progressive Movers holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the

Commission's files and records, it appears that Progressive Movers failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.

- G.J. Daniels, Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. G.J. Daniels holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that G.J. Daniels failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- 17 Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. LeMay holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that LeMay failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Hutson, Charles Edward d/b/a Hutson & Sons Moving & Packing is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Hutson Moving holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that although Hutson Moving timely filed an annual report it failed to pay the regulatory fees due May 1, 2005.
- Lincoln Moving & Storage Co., Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Lincoln Moving holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Lincoln Moving failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- 20 W.W. Kassner d/b/a Industrial Transfer Co., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Industrial Transfer holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the

Commission's files and records, it appears that Industrial Transfer failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.

- Lindsey, Jerry d/b/a Jerry Lindsey Excavating, is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Lindsey Excavating holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that although Lindsey Excavating timely filed an annual report it failed to pay the regulatory fees due May 1, 2005.
- Maskelyne Transfer & Storage, Inc. is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Maskelyne Transfer holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Maskelyne Transfer failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- 23 The Maust Corp is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010.
 Maust holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Maust failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Metropolitan Movers, Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Metropolitan Movers holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Metropolitan Movers failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Pacific Northwest Motor Freight Lines, Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Pacific Northwest holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Pacific Northwest failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.

- Pozzi Brothers Transportation, Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Pozzi Brothers holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Pozzi Brothers failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Risk, Don C., Jr. d/b/a People Movers, is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. People Movers holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that People Movers failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Specialty Moving, Inc. is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Specialty Moving holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Specialty Moving failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.
- Sell, William L., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010.
 William Sell holds authority to transport household goods in the state of
 Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it
 appears that although William Sell timely filed an annual report it failed to pay
 the regulatory fees due May 1, 2005.
- Swan's Moving & Storage Co., Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. Swan's Moving holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that Swan's Moving failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.

- T & T Milk Transport, Inc., is a public service company as defined in RCW 81.04.010. T & T Milk holds authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation. From the Commission's files and records, it appears that T & T Milk failed to pay the regulatory fees and file the annual report due on May 1, 2005.

II. ORDER AND NOTICE OF HEARING

- Synopsis: This initial order proposes to dismiss the Complaint and Order to Show Cause against fourteen household goods companies because they complied with reporting and fee requirements; and to dismiss the Complaint and Order to show cause against two companies that chose to voluntarily cancel their household goods carrier permits. In addition, this order proposes to cancel the household goods carrier permits of six household goods companies for failure to file an annual report as required by RCW 81.04.080, and failure to comply with reporting and fee requirements of WAC 480-15-480.
- Nature of the Proceeding: This is a proceeding in which the Commission ordered twenty-two household goods carriers to appear and show cause why their household goods permits should not be canceled.
- Procedural History: On November 29, 2005, the Commission entered a Complaint and 3 Order to Show Cause Why Permit Should Not Be Canceled For Failure to Pay Regulatory Fees and/or Failure to File 2005 Annual Report; and Notice of Hearing against Busby, Dan d/b/a Careful Movers (Careful Movers); Cascade Moving & Storage, Inc. (Cascade Moving); Cummings Moving Systems, LLC (Cummings Moving); Emad Kadem Al-Mosawi d/b/a Sunshine Movers (Sunshine Movers); Franz, Clara Mariene d/b/a Progressive Movers (Progressive Movers); G.J. Daniels, Inc. (G.J. Daniels); Harold Lemay Enterprises, Inc. (LeMay); Hutson, Charles Edward d/b/a Hutson & Sons Moving & Packing (Hutson Moving); W.W. Kassner d/b/a Industrial Transfer Co. (Industrial Transfer); Lincoln Moving & Storage Co., Inc. (Lincoln Moving); Lindsey, Jerry d/b/a Jerry Lindsey Excavating (Lindsey Excavating); Maskelyne Transfer & Storage, Inc. (Maskelyne Transfer); Maust Corp, The (Maust); Metropolitan Movers, Inc. (Metropolitan Movers); Pacific Northwest Motor Freight Lines, Inc. (Pacific Northwest); Pozzi Brothers Transportation, Inc. The matter was heard upon due and proper notice by Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Theodora M. Mace on December 19, 2005, in Olympia, Washington.

- Initial Order: The presiding ALJ proposes to dismiss the Complaint against Cascade Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving because the evidence shows that they have complied with the reporting and fee requirements of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480.
- The presiding ALJ proposes to dismiss the complaint against Cummings Moving and Pozzi Brothers because both companies voluntarily surrendered their household goods permits.
- Finally, the presiding ALJ proposes to cancel the household goods carrier permits of Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; and T&T Milk for failure to file their 2005 annual report and, in some instances, to pay their regulatory fees for 2005.
- Appearances: The Commission Staff is represented by Assistant Attorney General Jennifer Cameron-Rulkowski, Olympia, Washington. Specialty Moving is represented by David Wiley, attorney, Silverdale, Washington. No other respondent entered an appearance at the hearing.

DISCUSSION

- Background. Public service companies, including household goods carriers, are required to file an annual report with the Commission. RCW 81.04.080. In addition, they are required to file with the Commission a statement showing gross operating revenue from intrastate operations for the preceding calendar year, and to pay a fee to the Commission based on gross operating revenue. WAC 480-15-480. The Commission sends annual report forms to the address on record with the Commission for each household goods carrier permit holder. Id. Each permit holder must submit an annual report and remit regulatory fees by May 1 of each year. Id.
- The Commission sent annual report forms to each of the respondents of record in this proceeding. A search of Commission records indicated that respondents failed to comply with reporting and/or fee requirements of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480 by May 1, 2005.

DOCKET NO. TV- 051482 ORDER NO. 01

- On November 29, 2005, the Commission served a complaint and order to show cause on respondents requiring them to appear before the Commission on December 19, 2005, to answer the complaint, and to show cause why their household goods carrier permits should not be canceled for failure to file an annual report as required by RCW 81.04.080, and failure to comply with reporting and fee requirements of WAC 480-15-480.
- Hearing. At the hearing on December 19, 2005, Commission Staff presented the testimony of Ms. Betty Young, Compliance Specialist with the Commission's Businesses Practices Investigation Section. Ms. Young sponsored thirteen exhibits which were admitted in evidence. Ms. Young testified that respondents Cascade Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving complied with RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480 by filing their annual reports and/or remitting their regulatory prior to the Show Cause hearing. Tr. 7-13, 17-26, Exhibits 1-7; 9-14. Ms. Young recommended that the Commission not cancel the permits of these companies because they are now in compliance with statutory and regulatory reporting and fee requirements. Id.
- Ms. Young testified that, based on her investigation, the following companies did not file their 2005 Annual Reports or pay their 2005 regulatory fees: Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; Pozzi Brothers; and T&T Milk. Therefore, Ms. Young recommended that the Commission cancel the permits of these companies. Tr. 12-20,
- Commission Staff moved to dismiss Cummings Moving from this proceeding because the company had filed a letter voluntarily cancelling its permit.
- Post-hearing Motion to Dismiss Pozzi Brothers. On December 30, 2005, Commission Staff filed a motion to dismiss Pozzi Brothers from this proceeding. Staff stated that on December 16, 2005, Pozzi Brothers had filed a request to remove its household goods authority from its common carrier permit. The Commission granted the request on December 19, 2005. Staff stated that it did not become aware of the company's voluntary surrender of its household goods authority until December 29, 2005, ten days after the evidentiary proceeding in this case.

Docket No. TV-051948, Order Reissulng Permit As Amended, December 22, 2005.

- Discussion and Conclusion. The testimony and exhibits presented by Commission Staff establish that respondents Cascade Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving have complied with the reporting and fee requirements of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480. Accordingly, the proceedings against these respondents should be dismissed. Staff has also shown that Cummings Moving and Pozzi Brothers should be dismissed from this proceeding because they voluntarily surrendered their household goods operating authority.
- For the remaining respondents, this order would recommend cancellation of their permits. The Commission's Notice of Hearing on the Complaint and Order to Show Cause specified that if a party failed to attend or participate in the hearing, it may be held in default in accordance with RCW 34.05.400 and WAC 480-07-450. Under circumstances such as these, the Administrative Procedure Act (RCW 34.05.440) and the Commission's rules (WAC 480-07-450) allow the presiding officer to proceed to resolve the case without further notice to, or hearing for the benefit of, the party in default. RCW 34.05.440.
- The Commission may cancel a household goods carrier permit for good cause, including failure to submit an annual report or failure to pay regulatory fees. WAC 480-15-450. The unrebutted evidence presented by Commission Staff shows that Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; and T&T Milk violated Washington State law, and the Commission's rules. Therefore, the household goods permits of these companies should be cancelled.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 18 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the state of Washington, vested by statute with authority to regulate public service companies, including companies that hold authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation.
- 29 (2) Each of the respondents of record in this proceeding are public service companies as defined in RCW 81.04.010 and hold authority to transport household goods in the state of Washington for compensation.

- 20 (3) The Commission sent annual report forms and instructions to the address on record with the Commission for each of the named respondents.
- 21 (4) A search of Commission records indicated that respondents failed to comply with reporting and/or fee requirements of RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480 by May 1, 2005.
- 22 (5) On November 29, 2005, the Commission entered a Complaint and Order to Show Cause ordering each respondent to appear and show cause why its permit should not be canceled.
- During the Show Cause hearing on December 19, 2005, Commission Staff testified that respondents Cascade Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving filed their annual reports and/or remitting their regulatory prior to the hearing.
- 24 (7) Staff testified that Cummings Moving filed a request for voluntary cancellation of its permit.
- 25 (8) On December 30, 2005, Staff filed a motion to dismiss Pozzi Brothers from this proceeding because the Commission had granted the company's request to remove household goods authority from its common carrier permit.
- 26 (9) Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; and T&T Milk failed to appear at the hearing on October 26, 2005, and show cause why their permits should not be canceled.
- 27 (10) The files and records of the Commission show that Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; and T&T Milk failed to file their annual reports for 2004 or remit regulatory fees for 2005 in compliance with RCW 81.04.080 and WAC 480-15-480.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 28 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this proceeding and all parties to this proceeding.
- 29 (2) The Complaint and Order to Show Cause directed to Cascade Moving; Cummings Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; Pozzi Brothers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving should be dismissed.
- 30 (3) Good cause exists under WAC 480-15-450 to cancel the household goods carrier permits of Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; and T&T Milk.

ORDER

- IT IS HEREBY ORDERED That Cascade Moving; Cummings Moving; Sunshine Movers; G.J. Daniels; LeMay; Hutson Moving; Lincoln Moving; Lindsey Excavating; Maskelyne Transfer; Metropolitan Movers; People Movers; Pozzi Brothers; William Sell; Specialty Moving; Swan's Moving; and, Washington Moving are each dismissed from this proceeding.
- IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That the household goods carrier permits of Careful Movers; Progressive Movers; Industrial Transfer; Maust; Pacific Northwest; and T&T Milk are canceled.
