**BACKGROUND**

- 1     On April 28, 2006, Eschelon Telecom Inc., (Eschelon) filed with the Commission a petition for an extension of time to file the annual report of its subsidiary Advanced TelCom, Inc., (ATI) for 2005 as required by WAC 480-120-382. According to the company, it is unable to prepare the report due to reorganization following acquisition. The Company sought an extension until May 10, 2006, however, the report was not filed within the requested period.
- 2     Commission Staff reviewed the request and recommended dismissing ATI's request for exemption.

**FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS**

- 3     (1)    The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate public service companies, including competitively classified telecommunications companies. *RCW 80.01.040, Chapter 80.04 RCW and Chapter 80.36 RCW.*
- 4     (2)    ATI is a competitively classified telecommunications company and is a public service company subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.

- 5 (3) ATI is subject to the provisions of RCW 80.04.080 and WAC 480-120-382,  
requiring competitively classified telecommunications companies to file an annual  
report no later than May 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.
- 6 (4) WAC 480-120-015 provides that the Commission may grant an exemption from  
the provisions of any rule in Chapter 480-120 WAC, if consistent with the public  
interest, the purposes underlying regulation and applicable statutes.
- 7 (5) This matter came before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on  
May 17, 2006.
- 8 (6) After review of the petition filed in Docket UT-060677 by ATI on April 28, 2006,  
and giving due consideration, the Commission finds that the petition is moot and  
should be dismissed.

**ORDER**

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 9 (1) The exemption sought by ATI, Inc. for an extension until May 10, 2006, to file its  
2005 annual report is dismissed.
- 10 (2) The failure of ATI, Inc. to file its annual report by May 1, 2006, may result in the  
Commission invoking provisions of Chapter 80.04 RCW that provide for penalty  
assessments.
- 11 (3) The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and ATI, Inc., to  
effectuate the provisions of this Order.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the  
public interest, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
