1. Ensure that all drivers are fully and properly qualified before operating in intrastate commerce. Maintain a complete file as required for each driver, documenting the qualification process.
2. Do not allow drivers to drive intrastate unless they have been physically re-examined each 24 months.
3. Ensure that all drivers subject to pre-employment, random, reasonable cause, post accident, return to duty, and/or follow-up controlled substance testing are testedas required by 49 CFR Parts 40 and 382 of the FMCSR.
4. Notice: On April 28, 2003, the FMCSA published a final rule revising the hours-of-service regulations for commercial motor vehicle drivers. Under the new rule, drivers may drive 11 hours after 10 consecutive hours off-duty, but may not drive beyond the 14th hour after coming on-duty. Similar to existing rules, drivers may not drive after being on-duty for 60 hours in a seven-consecutive-day period or 70 hours in an eight-consecutive-day period. This on-duty cycle may be restarted whenever a driver takes at least 34 consecutive hours off-duty. Short-haul truck drivers, who routinely return to their place of dispatch after each duty tour and then are released from duty, may have an increased on-duty period of 16 hours once during any seven consecutive day period.

Carriers and commercial motor vehicle drivers are required to comply with the current hours-of-service rules through January 3, 2004. Compliance with the "new" regulations is mandatory for all carriers, except passenger-carrying operations, beginning on January 4, 2004. Passenger-carrying motor carriers and drivers are not subject to the new maximum driving limits. For more information on these regulations, please access the FMCSA website at www.fmcsa.dot.gov.

8. Ensure that the persons or entities that perform preventative maintenance inspections on your equipment are abiding by agreed time or mileage intervals. Ensure that records are kept of such periodic preventative maintenance inspections. Take corrective action, if schedules are not being adhered to.
9. Establish a systematic maintenance records program for all vehicles. Maintain a complete file for each subject vehicle, recording all repair, maintenance and inspection operations performed.

On October 30th and 31st, 20061 contacted Mr. Jeff Suth, General Manager, concerning a compliance review terminal safety inspection of records and equipment: Ms. Denise Johnston, Spec/Com Dispatcher, was also interviewed during my compliance review.

On October 30, 2006, I performed Level 5 terminal safety inspections of 5 of 18 vehicle currently owned/operated by Chipman Moving \& Storage, Inc. and/or leased both long-term and short-term from Enterprise Rental. The results of my inspections is as follows:

5 of 18 vehicles currently owned/operated and/or leased by Chipman Moving \& Storage, Inc. were inspected..
4 of 5 vehicles inspected were found with defects ( $80 \%$ defect ratio).
1 of 5 vehicles inspected was placed out-of-service ( $20 \%$ out-of-service ratio).
Specific defects can be seen by referencing my Uniform Driver/Vehicle inspection Report forms \#1176407 thru \#1176410. Only two of five vehicles were CVSA stickered at time of inspection.

Both power units inspected were found without permit name displayed on both sides of power unit doors in violation of CFR 392.2 and/or RCW 81.80 .305 and no copy of HG-6985 was found aboard vehicle in violation of CFR 392.2 and/or WAC 480.15.360.

I examined inspection, repair and maintenance records on all five vehicles inspected with the following results:
5 violations of CFR 396.3(b)(2), failing to have a means of indicating the nature and due date of the various inspection and
maintenance operations to be performed.
5 violations of CFR 396.3(b)(3), failing to keep a record of inspection, repairs and maintenance indicating their date and nature.
300 violations of CFR 396.11 (a), failing to require drivers to prepare driver vehicle inspection reports.
2 violations of CFR 396.17(a), using a commercial motor vehicle not periodically inspected.

## Part C

I examined five of seven driver's driver qualification files with the following results:
1 violation of CFR 391.45(b)(1), using a driver not medically examined and certified during the preceding 24 months.
2 violations of CFR 391.51 (b)(2), failing to maintain inquiries into driver's driving record in driver's qualification file.
2 violations of CFR 391.51 (b)(2), failing to maintain inquiries in driver's previous employment record.
2 violations of CFR 391.51 (b)(3), failing to maintain a road test certificate in driver's qualification file.
I examined five of seven driver's hours of service records from September 1, 2006 thru September 31, 2006 with the following results:

1 violation of CFR 395.3(b)(2), requiring or permitting a property-carrying commercial motor vehicle driver to drive after having
been on duty more than 70 duty hours in 8 consecutive days.
I checked to see if Chipman Moving \& Storage, Inc. had an accident register and/or recordable accidents in the past year. Chipman Moving \& Storage, Inc. had two non-recordable accidents in the past year; however did not maintain an accident register in violation CFR 390.15 (b).

I checked Chipman Moving \& Storage, Inc.'s alcohol and controlled substances testing program and found that all three Class A drivers were currently in a random alcohol and controlled substances testing program as part of their United Van Lines, LLC. agency agreement.

I checked all three Class A drivers for pre-employment controlled substances testing with the following results:
2 violations of CFR 382.301(a), Using a driver before the motor carrier has received a negative pre-employment controlled substance test result.

Driver, Faulauga Helu, hired on 02/05/06, drove for the first time on 02/10/06 and no pre-employment controlled substance test result found to date. Driver, Nofoao Filimaua, hired on 12/09/05, drove for the first time on 12/27/05 and no pre-employment controlled substance test result found to date.

Mr. Jeff Suth, General Manager, has not been designated and/or undersgone reasonable suspicion testing training receiving 60 minutes training for alcohol and/or 60 minutes training for controlled substances in violation of CFR 382.603.

This compliance review resulted in a conditional safety rating.
All violations were discussed and considerable technical, educational assistance was given to Mr. Jeff Suth, General Manager, and Ms. Denise Johnston, Spec/Com Dispatcher.
