Penalty Assessment Nos. TV-070463 and TV-071988

Dear Mr. Aislinn:

As you are aware, on March 16, 2007, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("commission") issued a Penalty Assessment (Docket TV-070463) against Miracle Movers, Inc. in the amount of \$1,500 for violation of commission rules by transporting household goods for compensation without the necessary permit. On October 29, 2007, the commission issued an additional Penalty Assessment (Docket TV-071988) against Miracle Movers, Inc. in the amount of \$2,000 for an additional violation of transporting household goods without a permit, and for advertising its services without listing the required permit number.

The commission has not received either the \$1,500 or the \$2,000 payment due and owing.

This is to notify you that the commission intends to forward your outstanding debt to a collection agency for collection. You likely will incur additional expenses and fees, including costs of collection, attorney's fees, and interest. These expenses and fees will be added to your outstanding \$3,500 balance.
