Re: Aberdeen Rate Center Numbering Waiver

Dear Mr. Danner:

By this letter Qwest is requesting a waiver of the utilization threshold requirements outlined in FCC's Numbering Resource Optimization Orders, FCC 00-429 and FCC 01-362 released in CC Docket No 99-200, which would allow PA/NeuStar, the Number Pooling Administrator, to assign a block of numbers that meets the needs of a specific Qwest customer.

The customer request is for 200 sequential telephone numbers in the 360 NPA, Aberdeen Rate Center. Specifically, the customer has requested that the numbers be in a single prefix and that the numbers not be in a 0XXX, 1XXXX, 8XXX, or 9XXX block due to their internal dialing plan. The customer intends to start using the new numbers as soon as possible. Qwest asks that the WUTC authorize NeuStar to assign a block that would meet the customer's needs from the 360 NPA Aberdeen Rate Center. The 360 NPA is forecasted to exhaust in the second quarter of 2012. There are 61 unassigned NXXs in the 360 NPA, and 26 blocks available in the PA pool inventory for the Aberdeen Rate Center.

The customer does not have any telephone numbers to return since the new numbers in this request are for growth. The original customer request has been provided with this letter as Confidential Attachment A.

In our effort to satisfy the customer's request, Qwest submitted a request to PA/NeuStar on February 5, 2009 for additional numbering resources. That application and the subsequent denial have been provided as Confidential Attachment B. In order for the request to be approved, Qwest will require a waiver of the current usage threshold for new numbering requests.

The FCC allows for a waiver of the rules when there is demonstrated need such as a specific customer request for a large block of numbers. The waiver process is specifically addressed in the FCC Third Report and Order ("Order") as the "safety valve" process (See FCC 01-362, paras. 57-66), which went into effect on March 14, 2002. The Order delegates the authority to hear claims for waivers to the state commissioners and recommends that state commissions act expeditiously. The Order proposes that state commissions review a waiver within 10 business days. (See Paras. 61,66)

Qwest respectfully requests that the Commission approve the request for a waiver of months to exhaust and rate center utilization threshold requirements, and direct PA/NeuStar to reserve and assign one block in the 360 NPA Aberdeen Rate Center to accommodate our customer's request.
