ROCHE HARBOR WATER SYSTEM PETITION FOR WAIVER OF FILING REQUIREMENTS

The Roche Harbor Water System ("Company") hereby respectfully submits this Petition for Water of WAC 480-07-505 and WAC 480-07-530. In the cover letter that accompanied the Company's filing of the Fourth Revised Sheet No. 2 and Fourth Revised Sheet No. W-2 on April 30, 2009, the Company requested a waiver of any filing requirements that were not met by the filing

The purpose of the filing made on April 30, 2009, is to recover costs for the replacement of activated carbon that will be included as an integral component of the Company's new treatment facilities for disinfection byproducts.

on April 30, 2009. This Petition will more formally petition for that requested waiver.

The disinfection byproducts result from chlorination of the water. Under certain conditions, chlorination can produce trihalomethanes and haloacetic acids. In the Company's instance, the production of these disinfection byproducts exceeds the maximum contaminant level established by the Environmental Protection Agency. Thus, treatment is necessary.

Law Office of Richard A. Finnigan 2112 Black Lake Blvd SW Olympia, WA 98512 (360) 956-7001 The activated carbon is used during the treatment process and dissipates over time. Thus, it is required that the carbon be replaced on an annual basis.

Work papers that accompanied the April 30, 2009, filing support the conclusion that the anticipated replacement costs for the carbon is approximately \$36,000 a year. The filing is designed to produce that amount of revenue and the revenue will be used <u>only</u> for the purpose of carbon replacement. The revenue will not be used for the general revenue requirements of the Company.

Because of the nature of the filing made on April 30, 2009, it does not appear appropriate to require the Company to proceed as though it were seeking an overall increase in revenue to cover the general revenue requirements of the Company. To this end, the Company hereby respectfully requests that the Commission grant a waiver of WAC 480-07-505 so that the April 30, 2009, filing is not treated as a general rate proceeding. Further, the Company respectfully requests the waiver of the requirements for the matters that are listed under WAC 480-07-530 that are to accompany a general rate filing.

Please note that a customer notice has been sent to the customers and filed with the Record Center. Please further note that a work paper specifically targeted at the cost of carbon replacement did accompany the April 30, 2009, filing.

Thank you for your consideration of this Petition for Waiver.
