Dear Mr. Danner:

On March 30, 2011 Puget Sound Energy (the "Company") filed with the Commission proposed changes to Schedule 137, Temporary Customer Charge or Credit. The Company's 1,082,384 electric customers who receive bundled service will see an increase in their bill due to removal of the credit that had been previously passed through under Schedule 137. The remaining 17 customers, who are retail wheeling customers, will see no change in their bills as a result of this filing. Pursuant to WAC 480-100-198, Notice Verification and Assistance, the Company is providing this statement that it has posted the above-referenced filing in accordance with WAC 480-100-193(1), Posting of Tariffs for Public Inspection and Review; Web, Telephone, and Mail Access.

The Company also states that notice to the public of the filing referenced above will be completed in accordance with Schedule 137 by providing notice in the form of a bill print message as allowed in WAC 480-100-195, Notice of Tariff Changes Other Than Increases in Recurring Charges and Restrictions in Access to Services. The following message will be printed on customer bills starting on May 3 and continue until all customers have received the message one time: Your electric bill this month reflects a May 1 increase due to the expiration of the renewable energy credit.
