Enclosed for filing, please find Puget Sound Energy, Inc.'s ("PSE") report identifying its tenyear achievable conservation potential for the period 2012-2021 and PSE's biennial conservation target for the period 2012-2013, pursuant to WAC 480-109-010(3). Styled as the Biennial Conservation Plan ("BCP"), the BCP is also submitted pursuant to WAC 480-07-880(2) and the Commission's Final Order in Docket No. UE-100177 ("Final Order"). An electronic copy of the BCP is being submitted through the Records Center Web Portal. Although the above noted requirements apply to electric conservation programs, the Company is providing updated details on its gas conservation programs in order to comply with the 2002 Rate Case Settlement Agreement, approved in Docket No UG-011571.

The BCP and supporting documents meet the requirements of WAC 480-109-010(3) in that they:

- Identify a ten-year achievable conservation potential;
- Identify a biennial conservation target;
- Outline the extent of public and commission staff participation in the development of the conservation metrics;
- Identify whether the conservation council's plan or the utility's IRP and acquisition process were the source of the ten-year conservation potential; and
- State how the utility prorated the ten-year projection to create the two-year conservation target.

More specifically the BCP also contains the following exhibits:

- Ten-Year Potential & Two-Year Targets;
- Exhibit 1: 2012-2013 Plan Budget Details;
- Exhibit 2: Program Cost Effectiveness Estimates, with addenda;

This Biennial Conservation Plan calls for acquiring electric conservation savings of 666,000 megawatt hours of electricity and 9.55 million therms of natural gas in the state of Washington. The electric budget is expected to be \$193.4 million and an expected natural gas budget of \$26.6 million. The Company intends on continuing to operate in compliance with the ongoing obligations of the 2010 Settlement Agreement Terms for Conservation in Docket No. UE-100177, save for the one-time obligations that are stated to terminate.

Attached revisions to tariff sheets (included in a separate filing and attached as an unnamed exhibit to the BCP) clarify terminology, update regulatory, State code or industry references and address significant changes in program strategies that are made to implement the BCP.

Also, included as supporting documents in this filing are the following attachments:
