## BACKGROUND

- I On August 24, 2012, YCOM Networks, Inc. d/b/a Fairpoint Communications (YCOM or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition for a partial exemption from filing its annual certifications and reports for 2011on or before July 31 as required by WAC 480-123-070. According to YCOM, it was unable to prepare the report due to a reorganization of company personnel. The person assigned the task of making the filing was not made aware of their new assignment and thus did not file the annual certification in a timely manner. This matter has been rectified and should not reoccur in the future.
- 2 Commission Staff reviewed the request and recommends granting YCOM's request for partial exemption. Partial exemption is sought because YCOM missed the filing deadline set forth in the rule. However, YCOM did submit the certifications and reports as required in WAC 480-123-070 subsections (1) through (7). YCOM's certifications and reports were received on August 10, 2012.

## FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

3 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate public service companies, including competitively classified telecommunications companies. RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.04 and RCW 80.36.

- 4 (2) YCOM is an eligible telecommunications carrier and a public service company subject to Commission jurisdiction.
- 5 (3) YCOM is subject to WAC 480-123-070, which requires eligible telecommunications carriers to file annual certifications and reports no later than July 31 of each year.
- 6 (4) Under WAC 480-07-110, the Commission may grant an exemption from or modify the application of its rules in individual cases if consistent with the public interest, the purposes underlying regulation, and applicable statutes.
- 7 (5) Strict application of the rule is a hardship on YCOM and its customers since the penalty for not being recertified as an eligible telecommunications carrier is that YCOM becomes ineligible to receive federal universal service support which is a substantial factor in its ability to provide ongoing communications service at high quality levels to its customers.
- 8 (6) This matter came before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on September 13, 2012.
- 9 (7) After review of the petition in Docket UT-121394 by YCOM filed on August 24, 2012, and giving due consideration, the Commission finds that a partial exemption from WAC 480-123-070 is in the public interest and is consistent with the purposes underlying the regulation and applicable statutes and should be granted.

## O R D E R

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- (1) The request by YCOM Networks, Inc. d/b/a Fairpoint Communications for a partial exemption from WAC 480-123-070 to file its 2011 annual certifications and reports on or before July 31 is granted.
- (2) The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and YCOM Networks, Inc. d/b/a Fairpoint Communications to effectuate the provisions of this Order.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
