We have will attach the DOT physicals for both Bob Walton and Bob Cullen. We are including a list of our corrections and the plan to ensure we do not end up in violation again. I am requesting a mitigation of the fines. The reason for this is because our income has been drastically reduced while many of our expenses have not. We currently have only 4 units in Washington State and our monthly insurance payments are 5561.00. This is for the 5-million-dollar requirement for any provider who transports rail crews in Washington State now. We are required to maintain 24/7 dispatch to meet the requirements for BNSF contract. I am willing to pay for our violations, but I think that 3000.00 would create too much of a hardship on a company of our size. I appreciate your willingness to work with us.

- 1 Using a driver not medically examined and certified.
- --Drivers now have a current DOT physical, a spreadsheet has been made listing the expiration dates, and a reminder has been added to the company calendar set for 30 days prior to expiration dates.
- 2 Reasonable Suspicion training for supervisor Ethan Futrelle.
- --Training has been completed through 360 Training on 10/7/20.
- 3 Using a driver who has not completed and furnished an employment application.
- --All drivers have or are in the process of filling out a new application that meets UTC requirements, which will be attached to the original application that was on file.
- 4 Failing to maintain a note to the annual review of the driver's driving record.
- --All current driving records have been reviewed and signed.
- 5 Failing to maintain a list or certificate relating to violations of motor vehicle laws and ordinances.
- --All drivers have or are in the process of filling out an Annual Driver's Certification of Violations to be placed in driver files.
- 6 Failing to place a note related to the verification of the medical examiner's listing on the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners in driver files.
- --All medical examiners have been verified and a Medical Examiner's National Registry Verification note has been completed and filed in the driver files.
- 7 Failing to have a means of indicating the nature and due date of the various inspection and maintenance operations to be performed.
- --Maintenance spreadsheet has been updated to include due dates/mileage for future service and what maintenance needs to be performed. Scheduled maintenance is also being tracked in our new vehicle tracking system which has a mileage/date countdown with alerts set for when a service is coming due.
- 8 Failing to certify that repairs were made or were not necessary.
- --Double checking all DVIR's when they are received and also before filing to make sure paperwork is filled out correctly with signature and date from supervisor who has deemed that either repairs have been completed or were not necessary for safe operation of the vehicle.
- 9 Failing to maintain evidence of inspector's qualifications.
- --Paperwork has been filled out and filed for qualifications of Ethan Futrelle and Ryan Salas.
