The proposal would add to rules governing railroad operations a rule addressing point protection. The proposed rule would require railroads to protect the leading end of train movements to add safety for employees that might be present on the tracks ahead of the movement, vehicles using road crossings, and trains on connected tracks. The purpose of this continuance of WSR 04-17-057 is to provide notice of a change in the adoption and hearing dates for this rulemaking from October 13, 2004, to December 10, 2004. In addition, the Commission seeks comments from interested persons by November 19, 2004, to assist the Commission in determining whether it has adequate state statutory authority to adopt the proposed rule.
