- Q. Please state your name and business address.
- My name is Christine Philipps. My business address is 10885 NE Fourth Street, A. Bellevue, Washington, 98004-5591.
- Q. By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
- A. I am employed by Puget Sound Energy, Inc. ("PSE") as Director, Federal Regulatory Affairs.
- Q. What are your duties as Director, Federal Regulatory Affairs?
- As Director, Federal Regulatory Affairs, I am responsible for the strategy, policy A. and overall direction of the Company's interest regarding federal regulatory issues. I am responsible for leading the implementation of the Company's corporate compliance program including monitoring operational compliance units, analyzing risk assessments based on federal regulations.
- Q. Please describe your prior duties as Manager of Resource Acquisition for PSE.
