We have had an 13 extensive discussion off the record prior to being on 14 the record, and there are apparently some issues that 15 Mr. Henrickson has with proceeding with the evidentiary 16 hearing at this time. 17 And, Mr. Henrickson, I will allow you to 18 explain why you do not believe that we should have the 19 hearing at this time right now. 20 MR. HENRICKSON: Because discovery has not 21 been made completely and it's not been my fault. It has 22 to do with the the State and doing their job. That 23 would be the number one issue. They said that they made 24 a mistake and sent the wrong files in incorrect format. 25 So what do you want me to do?

First of all, Staff -- well, first, I guess, there's no discovery in a brief adjudicative proceeding per the Commission's rules. He does have a public records request. Staff produced the required records in the format that Staff had them in, which what the Public Records Act requires, in their native format.
