PROCEEDINGS

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JUDGE SCHAER: Let's be on the record. We are here this morning for a prehearing conference in Docket No. TR-010194, which is a filing by Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railroad granting permission to close a railroad crossing at 156th Street Northeast in Snohomish County. We are in the Commission's Hearing Room 108 in the Commission's headquarters building in Olympia, Washington. I'm Marjorie Schaer, and I'm the administrative law judge now assigned by the Commission to this proceeding.

Our purpose this morning is to organize the materials for hearings in this matter that will take place in Everett on October 11th and 12th. Let's start out taking appearances from all of the parties starting with the Company, please.

MR. WALKLEY: My name is Robert E. Walkley, attorney at law, 20349 Northeast 34th Court, Sammamish, Washington, 98074-4319. Telephone and fax, (425) 868-4846. E-mail is rewalkey@earthlink.net, and I represent the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railroad, the petitioner.

MR. STIER: Jeff Stier. I'm assistant attorney general representing Washington State

Fax is 586-5522, and e-mail is 19 jthompso@wutc.wa.gov. 20 JUDGE SCHAER: This prehearing conference was 21 scheduled by a letter sent out on September 14th, and 22 in that letter, the parties were told that the purpose 23 of this conference is going to be to exchange witness 2.4 lists and proposed exhibits and to discuss the order of 25 presentation of witnesses. So what I'd like to

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accomplish this morning is to get those distributed to look at whether we want to go ahead and premark as much as we can to save time in the hearings. I recognize we also have a time constraint on this hearing due to a need by counsel for the Railroad to be at an 11 o'clock presentation before the Commission.

I'm not sure if it would be more efficient to do this on or off the record. Does anyone have a preference?

MR. WALKLEY: I think off the record for now, Your Honor.

JUDGE SCHAER: Off the record. (Discussion off the record.)

JUDGE SCHAER: While we were off the record, we had an extensive discussion of who the witnesses in this proceeding will be and what the order of witnesses will be. We also had distribution of exhibits from all four parties. What we have decided to do is to have those parties who have not already done so put together an exhibit list of the exhibits they will be presenting in order by witness and have that ready by tomorrow morning. I'll also ask that the parties look at each other's exhibits and determine which ones could come in by stipulation. It sounds like perhaps most or all of them can at this point.

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I've asked the Department of Transportation to number their exhibits from 1 to 20. I've asked Burlington Northern Santa Fe to number their exhibits from 21 through 40. Snohomish County had provided an exhibit list at the top of their materials, and I have gone through those exhibits which were lettered and numbered those consecutively from 41 through 58, and then I have two exhibits provided by Commission staff, which I've identified as Nos. 61 and 62.

So that's pretty much what we are going to do today. I've asked the parties to look these over and know by tomorrow morning if there are any exhibits they are going to object to, and otherwise, we are going to get all of the exhibits in the record so we can be ready when the hearing starts at ten o'clock. I'm going to ask you, Mr. Thompson, to prepare a short exhibit list for your two documents so we can have the convenience of putting the four lists together and having everything in order.

Is there anything else we need to talk about this morning? Hearing nothing, I will tell the counsel I appreciate how you are working together to make things go smoothly, and we have decided we will continue this prehearing conference until 9:30 tomorrow morning, and we will be meeting then in Snohomish

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    County. We will reconvene tomorrow morning, Thursday,
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     October 11th, 2001, at 9:30 in the morning at the WSU
    Cooperative Extension office in Snohomish County
    located at 600 128th Street Southeast in Everett. At
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    that point, we will hold another prehearing conference
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    to be followed at ten o'clock by the beginning of the
    hearings in this matter, which are scheduled for
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     tomorrow and Friday. Is there anything else we need to
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    discuss this morning? Hearing nothing, then this
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    hearing is continued until tomorrow, and we are off the
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    record.
