By this email I am submitting my request that WUTC re-examine the criteria by which our power company, PSE, will be allowed to install "Smart Meters" on Whidbey Island.

- The technology of these meters produces undesired exposure to EMF. I have source documents that enumerate multiple negative health aspects from exposure to Smart Meter operations.
- The design of many Smart Meters does not meet common sense safety requirements for fire resistance, reliability, and operational integrity.
- The operational cycle of Smart Meters is almost continuous, notwithstanding assurances from PSE representatives that they transmit only once an hour; this information from a PSE employee who visited my home to install a net metering device for solar power.
- Contrary to information provided and promoted by PSE, Smart Meters do not confer any benefit to the home occupant.
- Many locations that have installed Smart Meters have had to replace them or reverse the installations due to equipment deficiencies.
- The provision to "opt out" is onerous to the home occupant.
- Smart Meters do not serve the interests of any stakeholders in electrical system distribution, not even PSE.

I urge you to address all these issues with diligence and care during the forthcoming hearings.
