Re: Rulemaking Concerning Telecommunications Service (Line) Extensions - Docket UT-073014 - SBEIS Response

On February 22, 2008, in response to the January 10, 2008 Notice of Opportunity to Comment on Draft Rules ("Notice"), a coalition of telecommunications companies ("Coalition") that filed initial comments and a draft rule in this rulemaking proceeding, filed comments and proposed modifications to the Commission's draft rule.
