Hello WUTC Commissioners Danner, Rendahl, and Balasbas, and also Executive Director Maxwell.

I'm writing to offer brief comments on PSE's CEIP, (Docket UE-210795).

I ask that the Utilities and Transportation Commission require Puget Sound Energy to revise its CEIP to reflect the following outcomes.

1. The use of resource planning modeling that incorporates weather data from only the most recent decades, plus projected future weather trends based on climate change. (Climate change is the driving reason for making the clean energy transition, yet PSE has continued to use old and outdated weather data in their planning.)
2. A more accelerated acquisition of extensive solar and wind generating capacities in order to more rapidly replace coal and fossil gas generating facilities.
3. A greater ramp up in the promotion of energy conservation.
4. The creation of both a robust Demand Response program, and a Time Varying Rates program, so as to reduce peak loads while society transitions toward electrification, and thereby avoid the build up of unnecessary electricity generation infrastructure.

I shall be thankful of your efforts to push PSE toward these ends.
