Frontier has provided no indication, data or testimony indicating that it has undertaken any review of the Spingo "carve-out" process and, as Mr. Hill points out in his testimony, the accounting firm that indicates the Spingo financial statements meet FASB standards also states that those financial statements, which are based on allocations undertaken by Verizon management, are the "responsibility" of Verizon management.
