# OLYMPIC PIPE LINE COMPANY

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Effective October 15, 2002, Olympic Pipe Line Company establishes the refund procedures as outlined below in response to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission Twentieth Supplemental Order in Docket No. TO-011472, dated September 27, 2002. Paragraph No. 408 of this Order states:

**"Olympic must file temporary tariff revisions that are designed to return to individual ratepayers over a two-year period or a comparable measure of throughput the amount by which the customer's payments under interim rates exceeded the amount that would have been due under the rates authorized herein, plus interest at the rate authorized herein as the Company's overall rate of return. Olympic may consult with other parties in preparing this revision."**

Those shippers due refunds will be reimbursed by Olympic through the following mechanism:

1. For all shipments between February 2, 2002, and October 8, 2002, for each shipper Olympic will calculate the differences between actual billed amounts at the temporary 24.3% interim rates and the comparable amount had the permanent 2.52% increase been in effect.
2. Interest will then be applied to the above refund amounts at the 7.6% rate required by the WUTC in accordance with when monthly payments were due during the corresponding March 31, 2002 – October 31, 2002 period.
3. Interest at 7.6% on the unpaid balance will also accrue over the two-year pay back period. Using a loan-payment type formula, Olympic will calculate a monthly fixed refund amount that will be equal for each of the 24 months in the payback period, and which incorporates the above principal and interest amounts. The first refund will be made on the November 2002, billing for shipments made in October 2002, and continue on each subsequent billing date for the remaining 23 months.
4. Olympic will issue transportation credits to accomplish the above refunds. If for any month current transportation charges are less than the refund amount, a check will also be issued for the difference. For a shipper who is due a refund but does not ship in a particular month, a check will be issued to this shipper covering the total monthly refund due for that month.
5. For those shippers no longer using the Olympic system but who qualify for a refund, Olympic will issue a single refund check.
