- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 JUDGE MACE: Let's be on the record in Docket
- 3 Number PG-041624, Washington Utilities and
- 4 Transportation Commission versus Puget Sound Energy.
- 5 This is June 24th, 2005. We are convened at the offices
- 6 of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
- 7 Commission in Olympia, Washington. My name is Theodora
- 8 Mace, I'm the Administrative Law Judge who has been
- 9 assigned to this case.
- 10 And now I would like to have the oral
- 11 appearances of counsel, and I will begin with the
- 12 company, and then I will ask Staff and then the City to
- 13 enter their appearances. The counsel for Commission
- 14 Staff and the company need only enter their short form
- 15 appearance, but, Ms. Zakrzewski, since this is the first
- 16 time you have entered an appearance in this case, I need
- 17 to ask you to give us your name, address, who you
- 18 represent, and your phone, fax, and E-mail addresses
- 19 when I call on you.
- 20 MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: Yes, ma'am.
- JUDGE MACE: All right, thank you.
- 22 Let me hear first from Commission Staff, I
- 23 believe I said Commission Staff first.
- MR. TROTTER: This is Don T. Trotter,
- 25 Assistant Attorney General.

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- 1 JUDGE MACE: Thank you.
- 2 And for the company.
- 3 MR. WILLIAMS: James Williams and Amanda
- 4 Beane of Perkins Coie on behalf of Puget Sound Energy.
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you.
- 6 And Ms. Zakrzewski.
- 7 MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: Yes, this is Cheryl
- 8 Zakrzewski from the City of Bellevue. My last name is
- 9 spelled Z-A-K-R-Z-E-W-S-K-I. The address of the City of
- 10 Bellevue is 11511 Main Street, Bellevue, Washington
- 11 98004. My direct phone line is (425) 452-4081. My fax
- 12 number is (425) 452-7256.
- JUDGE MACE: And do you have an E-mail
- 14 address?
- MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: I do, it's C as in Cheryl
- Zakrzewski, Z-A-K-R-Z-E-W-S-K-I, @ci.bellevue.wa.us.
- JUDGE MACE: Okay, thank you.
- 18 Very well, and is there anyone else on the
- 19 conference bridge who wants to enter an appearance?
- 20 MR. SEACREST: Not to enter an appearance,
- 21 but this is Steve Seacrest, I'm Assistant General
- 22 Counsel with Puget Sound Energy working with James and
- 23 Amanda.
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you. The purpose of the
- 25 hearing today, as I mentioned earlier, was to discuss

- 1 scheduling. I had had a request from Commission Staff
- 2 that the scheduling be changed in view of the fact that
- 3 the company had not been able to provide certain
- 4 information that it had agreed to provide at a certain
- 5 time. My understanding is that the company has agreed
- 6 to provide that information and will be or has already
- 7 provided the information, and I also have had a proposed
- 8 schedule from Staff.
- 9 Before I go any further though, let me ask
- 10 Mr. Trotter, Mr. Trotter, would you please give me an
- 11 update on the status of discovery and the receipt of
- 12 information from the company and also the revised
- 13 schedule or the proposed revised schedule.
- 14 MR. TROTTER: Yes, Your Honor. As our motion
- 15 stated, there were two specific items, the riser study
- 16 and the coating survey. We expected the riser study
- 17 around the 6th of May and the coating survey around the
- 18 13th, but we understood that those were estimates when
- 19 we set the schedule together. I don't think those were
- 20 necessarily promised dates but rather the company's best
- 21 estimate at the time.
- 22 As we rolled on through time, we were
- 23 contacted by the company, the information simply was not
- 24 completed and could not be provided. And so by June
- 25 15th, we were facing a June 28th distribution date that

- 1 we could not meet, so we filed the motion.
- 2 Shortly after the motion was filed on June
- 3 15th, we received the riser study, and last Tuesday,
- 4 June 21st, we received the coating survey. So after we
- 5 had a chance to evaluate those, we had a discussion of
- 6 how this would affect the schedule. And so I came up in
- 7 consultation with Staff with the schedule that I
- 8 distributed to you by E-mail today, and this was also
- 9 circulated to the parties yesterday, which kept the
- 10 current hearing dates intact. I did consult the
- 11 Commission's Kippi Walker of the ALJ section to see what
- 12 hearing dates were available, and due to other cases and
- 13 other dates already scheduled, the next possible hearing
- 14 dates were the first week of November. And from Staff's
- 15 perspective, we just simply didn't want this case to go
- 16 on that long, so we tried, made our best effort to put a
- 17 schedule together that would accommodate the dates that
- 18 are available. There are some dates in October that are
- 19 scheduled now that by the time we get to October may be
- 20 freed up, but Ms. Walker indicated there's no way to
- 21 double schedule those dates now, it simply can't be
- 22 done. I certainly understand that. So given those
- 23 parameters, this is the schedule we came up with.
- 24 As you know by now, we circulated that to the
- 25 other parties. It is my understanding that PSE is

- 1 willing to agree to it. The City of Bellevue, however,
- 2 has some concerns about it. So I think that's where we
- 3 are.
- 4 JUDGE MACE: All right, thank you.
- 5 Mr. Williams, is it true that the company is
- 6 in agreement with this schedule?
- 7 MR. WILLIAMS: It is true. The only thing
- 8 that we would ask be added by you, Judge Mace, is a
- 9 settlement conference date that Mr. Trotter and I have
- 10 spoken about and agreed upon. I didn't speak to the
- 11 City of Bellevue about it because it just happened
- 12 before the call, so.
- JUDGE MACE: Well, I may give you time to
- 14 discuss that today yet, but one additional item I would
- 15 have to add would be a prehearing conference for the
- 16 marking of exhibits, which I'm not sure if we included
- 17 in the original schedule. But if it's not included, I
- 18 will have to insert a date sometime a few days prior to
- 19 the hearing date. I will make a note about that.
- 20 Ms. Zakrzewski, let me turn to you now and
- 21 ask you to state your concerns about the proposed
- 22 schedule change.
- MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: The problem is I don't know
- 24 if I have any concerns. We did not receive the coating
- 25 survey until this morning. I have not had the

- 1 opportunity to pass it on to anybody so that we can
- 2 review it and have our expert look at it. I may not
- 3 have a problem, we may not be submitting anything
- 4 separately. I don't know that, because we haven't had
- 5 any time to digest anything, and I need to leave myself
- 6 some opportunity to send this on to my expert and to
- 7 have him review it, get back to me, and in my case
- 8 representing the City, if there's any recommendations, I
- 9 need to meet with my city council. My concern is the
- 10 July date for the City to submit anything isn't feasible
- 11 in light of -- it may not be feasible if there is any
- 12 concern. I simply don't know if there is any concern
- 13 yet, because I just got the information that we need to
- 14 digest.
- 15 JUDGE MACE: Surely. Well, let me ask you
- 16 this, the proposed new date for filing is July 21st, do
- 17 you think that you would have the information at least
- 18 to know whether the City would have a concern prior to
- 19 that date so that what we could do is stay with the date
- 20 right now, and then as soon as you discovered you had a
- 21 concern, you could advise me, and we could revisit the
- 22 schedule.
- 23 MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: That sounds perfectly
- 24 acceptable to me. I will be passing on the information
- 25 as soon as we get off this call today and start that

- 1 process rolling, and hopefully I should get an answer in
- 2 a week or two. And then as soon as I get an answer and
- 3 I feel that I will need some additional time, I will be
- 4 glad to bring it to your attention and to the attention
- 5 of all of the parties.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: All right, if that works for you
- 7 then what I would like to do is go ahead and revise the
- 8 schedule according to this proposal with the caveat that
- 9 if the City finds that it has a problem with the
- 10 schedule, it can request additional time, and presumably
- 11 you would work with the parties to determine what would
- 12 be an appropriate solution. I'm not saying that if you
- 13 needed additional time I could automatically grant it
- 14 because that is something that's in the Commission's
- 15 purview, but that certainly would be considered.
- MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: Okay.
- 17 JUDGE MACE: Is there anything else that we
- 18 need to address as far as the schedule is concerned?
- 19 MR. TROTTER: I think Mr. Williams had an
- 20 idea about the settlement.
- 21 JUDGE MACE: Do you need time to discuss that
- 22 among yourselves, and if so, how much?
- MR. TROTTER: I would just propose
- 24 Mr. Williams put it on the table.
- 25 MR. WILLIAMS: It's not a real hard concept,

- 1 Your Honor, we just want a settlement conference two
- 2 days, August 22nd and August 23rd.
- JUDGE MACE: I'm sorry, August? Say it
- 4 again, I didn't hear you.
- 5 MR. WILLIAMS: August 22nd and August 23rd.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: And I unfortunately don't have a
- 7 calendar in front of me, but it's more something that
- 8 the parties would be concerned about. I'm presuming
- 9 that you want to set this up so that the parties would
- 10 attend.
- 11 MR. WILLIAMS: Correct, Monday and Tuesday.
- JUDGE MACE: Mr. Trotter?
- 13 MR. TROTTER: That is acceptable to Staff.
- JUDGE MACE: Ms. Zakrzewski?
- MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: I'm available on those
- 16 dates.
- 17 JUDGE MACE: And do you have a proposed
- 18 location, Mr. Williams?
- 19 MR. WILLIAMS: Yes, Your Honor, Olympia,
- 20 Mr. Trotter's office.
- 21 MR. TROTTER: Yeah, we'll find a room here at
- 22 the Commission that will fit the number of people that
- 23 will be involved.
- JUDGE MACE: Yes, if you need to, you can
- 25 contact Kippi Walker, and she can set up a room like

- 1 this. Well, you know how to do that.
- 2 MR. TROTTER: Yeah.
- JUDGE MACE: Ms. Zakrzewski, would that be
- 4 suitable?
- 5 MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: That's fine.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: All right, then I will include
- 7 that in the schedule as well.
- 8 MR. WILLIAMS: Your Honor, is there any way
- 9 you can also try to get Judge Wallis to do it?
- JUDGE MACE: Well, okay, I guess I didn't
- 11 understand that you wanted to have his assistance. I
- 12 can ask him if the parties are in agreement.
- MR. TROTTER: Yeah, Staff believes that a
- 14 settlement judge would be useful.
- JUDGE MACE: All right.
- 16 And, Ms. Zakrzewski, do you have any
- 17 objection to that?
- MS. ZAKRZEWSKI: No.
- 19 JUDGE MACE: You probably don't know Judge
- 20 Wallis, he is the director of this division, and he has
- 21 presided as settlement judge on several cases at the
- 22 Commission thus far, so he's pretty experienced in that
- 23 area.
- MR. TROTTER: And, Your Honor, we certainly
- 25 have no problem with Judge Wallis assuming he is

- 1 available.
- 2 JUDGE MACE: If he's available. If he's not
- 3 available, there is the possibility it might be Judge
- 4 Moss, conceivably Judge Rendahl, I don't know, but I'm
- 5 sure the Commission would want to try to work with you
- 6 on this. I can't guarantee it, but I will certainly
- 7 discuss it with him.
- 8 MR. TROTTER: But PSE has stated a preference
- 9 for Judge Wallis, and that's perfectly fine with us. We
- 10 have a lot of confidence in his abilities.
- 11 JUDGE MACE: And if it turned out that Judge
- 12 Wallis was unable to preside, would the parties have an
- 13 objection to asking Judge Moss?
- MR. WILLIAMS: Your Honor, I haven't spoken
- 15 to my client about that yet.
- JUDGE MACE: Okay, well, let's start with
- 17 Judge Wallis, and let's see where we go from there.
- 18 All right then, it looks like there's a
- 19 settlement conference scheduled for August 22nd and
- 20 23rd. I'm assuming the parties will discuss the exact
- 21 parameters of that, when it will start precisely in the
- 22 morning on August 22nd. Also I will contact Judge
- 23 Wallis to see if he can be available on those two dates
- 24 to assist the parties in their settlement negotiations.
- 25 I will advise you I hope next week, early next week, of

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1	his availability.
2	MR. TROTTER: Thank you, Your Honor.
3	JUDGE MACE: All right, is there anything
4	else?
5	MR. TROTTER: Well, it sounds to me like
6	you're predisposed to grant this request.
7	JUDGE MACE: Yes, it seems reasonable because
8	there's no change in the hearing date. It's the hearing
9	dates that I would be concerned about.
10	MR. TROTTER: So could you simply strike
11	Tuesday's distribution date for Staff in the meantime?
12	JUDGE MACE: Yes, certainly.
13	All right, anything else?
14	MR. WILLIAMS: We thank you for your time,
15	Your Honor.
16	JUDGE MACE: All right, thank you very much.
17	(Hearing adjourned at 12:45 p.m.)
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
