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- 1 On May 20, 2019, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered Order 05, Granting Staff’s Renewed Motion for Cancellation of Household Goods Permit; Cancelling Provisional Household Goods Permit; Denying Application for Permanent Authority (Order 05) in these consolidated dockets. Order 05 granted Commission staff’s (Staff) motion to cancel the provisional household goods carrier permit of MVP Moving and Storage LLC (MVP) and denied MVP’s application for a permanent household goods carrier permit in accordance with WAC 480-15-305(3).
- 2 On June 20, 2019, MVP submitted an application for reinstatement (Application).
- 3 On September 23, 2019, the Commission issued a Notice of Intent to Deny application for Reinstatement; Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (Notice) in these dockets, informing the Company that the Commission intended to deny the Application and provided an opportunity for the Company to request a hearing
- 4 On October 28, 2019, MVP Moving filed a request for hearing in these dockets.
- 5 Pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate for resolving the issues in this docket.
- 6 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter at 1:30 p.m. on Friday, November 22, 2019, in the**

**Commission's Richard Hemstad Hearing Room, 621 Woodland Square Loop SE,
Lacey, Washington.**

- 7 The record in this case will consist of any documents regarding the matter that are considered by or prepared for the presiding officer for the brief adjudicative proceeding and a transcript of any oral statements given at the hearing, which statements will be given under oath.
- 8 Written notice of any other stage in the proceeding or other formal proceedings that the Commission may deem appropriate will be given during the course of this case. The Commission will provide at its offices in Lacey, Washington, copies of documents in the current record for use by the parties or others who may want to review them.
- 9 Parties wishing to submit any other documents for consideration at the brief adjudicative proceeding must file with the Commission all proposed exhibits, as well as a list enumerating and describing them, **no later than 5 p.m. on Friday, November 15, 2019**, and bring an original and three (3) copies to the hearing. Filing shall be in accordance with WAC 480-07-140.
- 10 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.**
