Proposed Tariff revisions filed as a general rate case that would increase annual revenues by approximately \$46,000 (17.2 percent) as a rate plan over a two year period. The company will receive \$38,506 (14.3 percent) in the first year and then the second year rates will produce the full \$46,000 revenue requirement. The proposed increase is to cover increased operating expenses of labor, insurance, fuel, electricity, and other operating costs. Additionally, ancillary charges will also be adjusted to recover cost directly incurred by customers. The water system provides water service to approximately 900 customers Mason County. The company's last general rate increases were effective on January 1, 2011, for \$38,940 (17.5 percent).
