3. UE-240288 Puget Sound Energy

Annual Power Cost Adjuster filing, requesting approval for an actual 2023 ratepayer rebate of \$22.2 million, a provisional 2024 ratepayer surcharge of \$98.2 million, and collection of the \$76 million net balance amortized over 15 months from October 2024 through December 2025. A typical residential ratepayer using 800 kWh per month would see a \$2.31, or 2.11 percent, bill increase from October 2024 through December 2024 and a \$0.48, or 0.44 percent, bill decrease from October 2024 through December 2025.

4. UE-240461 PacifiCorp

Annual Power Cost Adjustment Mechanism filing, requesting approval for a net power cost revenue requirement increase of \$84.5 million, or 20 percent, to be recovered over 12 months effective October 1, 2024, and a negative Production Tax Credit of \$1.1 million. A typical residential ratepayer using 1,200 kWh would see a \$23.57, or 17.7 percent, increase in their bill each month.

Commission staff and the Company have agreed to a lower additional annual revenue amount of approximately \$16,600 (9.1 percent). The Company provides regulated solid waste collection service to approximately 850 customers in Adams and Lincoln Counties. The Company's last general rate increase became effective in 2009.

General rate increase request that, as originally filed, would have generated approximately \$965,000 (5.9 percent) additional annual revenue for the collection of garbage, recycling, and yard waste services. Commission staff and the Company have agreed to a lower revenue requirement amount of approximately \$934,000 (5.7 percent). The Company provides regulated solid waste collection service to approximately 17,000 residential, 7,200 commercial, and 500 drop box customers in Yakima County. The Company's last general rate increase became effective on October 1, 2023.

Tariff revisions for a \$1.73 decrease (debit decrease from \$1.62 to credit of \$0.11) per month for residential recycling customers and \$0.39 decrease (debit decreases from \$0.37 to credit of \$.02) month for multi-family recycling customers with a 96 gallon receptacle. The Company serves approximately 1,750 residential and 550 multi-family recycling customers in Snohomish County.

Less than statutory notice request for customer notice and request tariff revisions for a \$0.91 decrease (debit decrease from \$0.19 to credit of \$0.72) per month for residential recycling customers and \$0.40 decrease (debit decreases from \$0.06 to credit of \$.34) month for multi-family recycling customers. The Company serves 6,000 customers in Whitman County.

Less than statutory notice request for tariff revisions by Waste Management of Skagit correcting clerical errors that occurred in Docket TG-240581 in Item 100, Residential Service. Tariff revisions were allowed to take effect September 1, 2024, for disposal fee increases at the Skagit County Recycling and Transfer Station. During the filing, 64-and 96-gallon service rates were incorrectly removed from the Tariff.

8. TG-240712 Harold LeMay Enterprises Inc.

Less than statutory notice request for tariff revisions that would reduce annual revenue by approximately \$72,000 additional annual revenue due to a miscalculation of disposal fees set by the Lewis County Disposal District. On July 1, 2024, disposal fees increased from \$100 per ton to \$116 per ton at the Lewis County landfill. However, the Company filed to increase fees from \$100 per ton to \$120 per ton, which inadvertently included 3.6 percent solid waste tax. The Company now proposes to decrease tariff rates and provide bill credits to all customers for July, August, and September 2024. The Company serves approximately 15,000 garbage customers in Lewis County.
